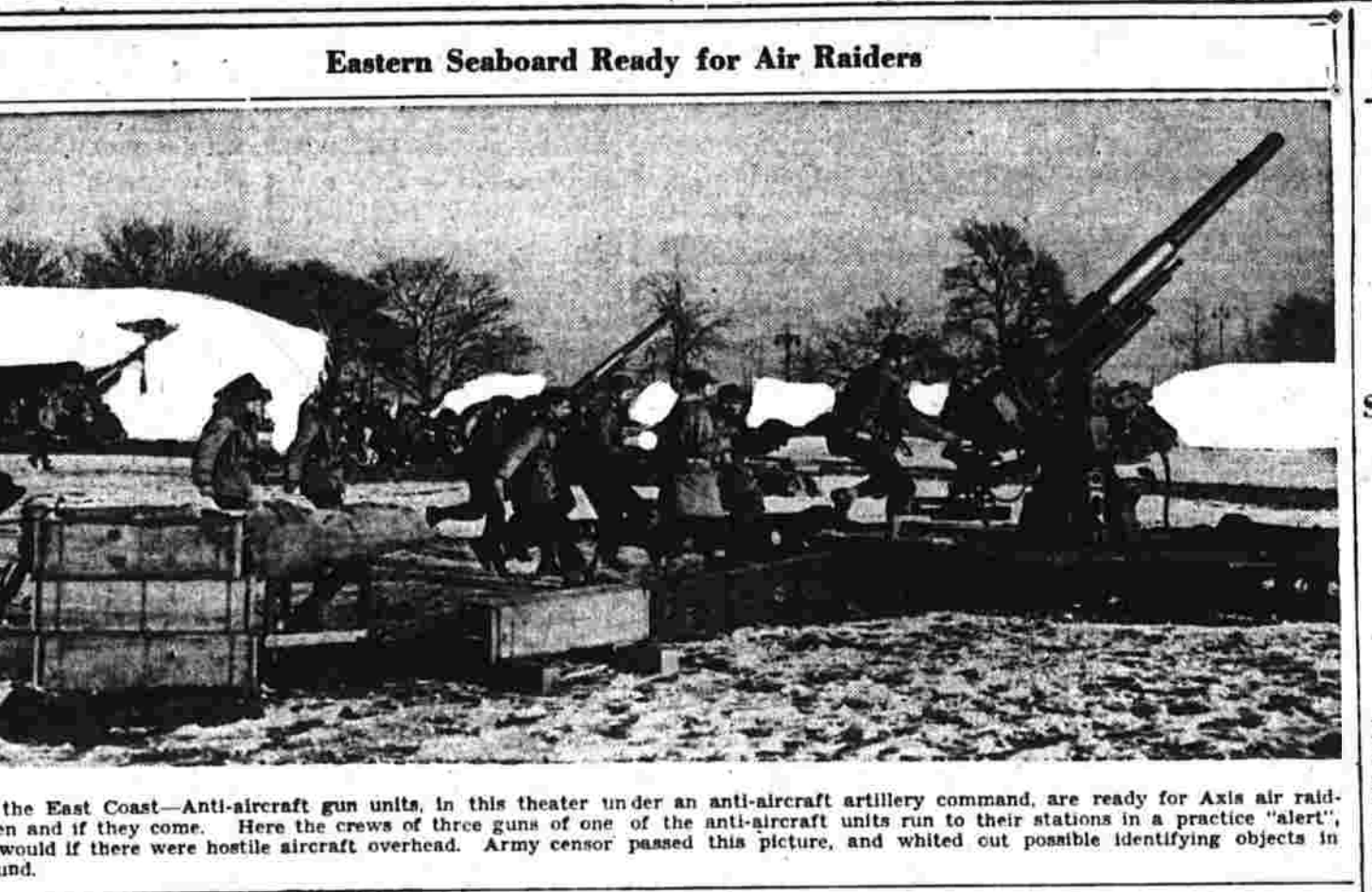

Passenger Ship Escapes Subs. New York, Feb. 3.—(AP)—An American passenger ship arrived today after a thrilling escape from three Axis submarines which made crash dives when a patrol plane appeared on the scene while the unarmed ship was trying to run one of the U-boats. Although the captain of the liner then named was withheld by the Navy, a comment on his attempt to ram the underwater raiders crew members said the U-boats were sighted on the surface last Sunday afternoon shortly after the vessel left a West Indian port.

Famine Uterly Appalling. Washington, Feb. 3.—(AP)—Un-dersecretary of State Welles said today that the submarine Axis-occupied Greece had become utterly appalling. The State Department today said a press conference, has been receiving disturbing reports from the Greek situation for some time past, both from European sources and from the Greek government here. Particularly alarming, he said, are reports of a systematic plan of destruction of German occupations.
