PHOTOGRAPHER ABOARD CRUISER DURING ATTACK

Photographer Aboard Cruiser During Attack

Sees Great Guns from Ship Rake Strongly Held Japanese Island From End to End.

Pearl Harbor, T. H., Feb. 13.—The story of the United States Navy's roaring might which broke the peace of a tropic dawn with a Gilbert island was unfolded today by Jack Rice, Associated Press photographer who was aboard a cruiser participating in the attack.

Here's his story: "I was great gun from our ship rake the strongly held Japanese island and from one end to the other today. They fought off repeated attacks from our planes.

Stunning Show of Strategy. "And as we stand around now, looking at the wreckage and the wreckage of the Japanese, I have a hand on the shoulder of a young man who took the lead in this force at attack."

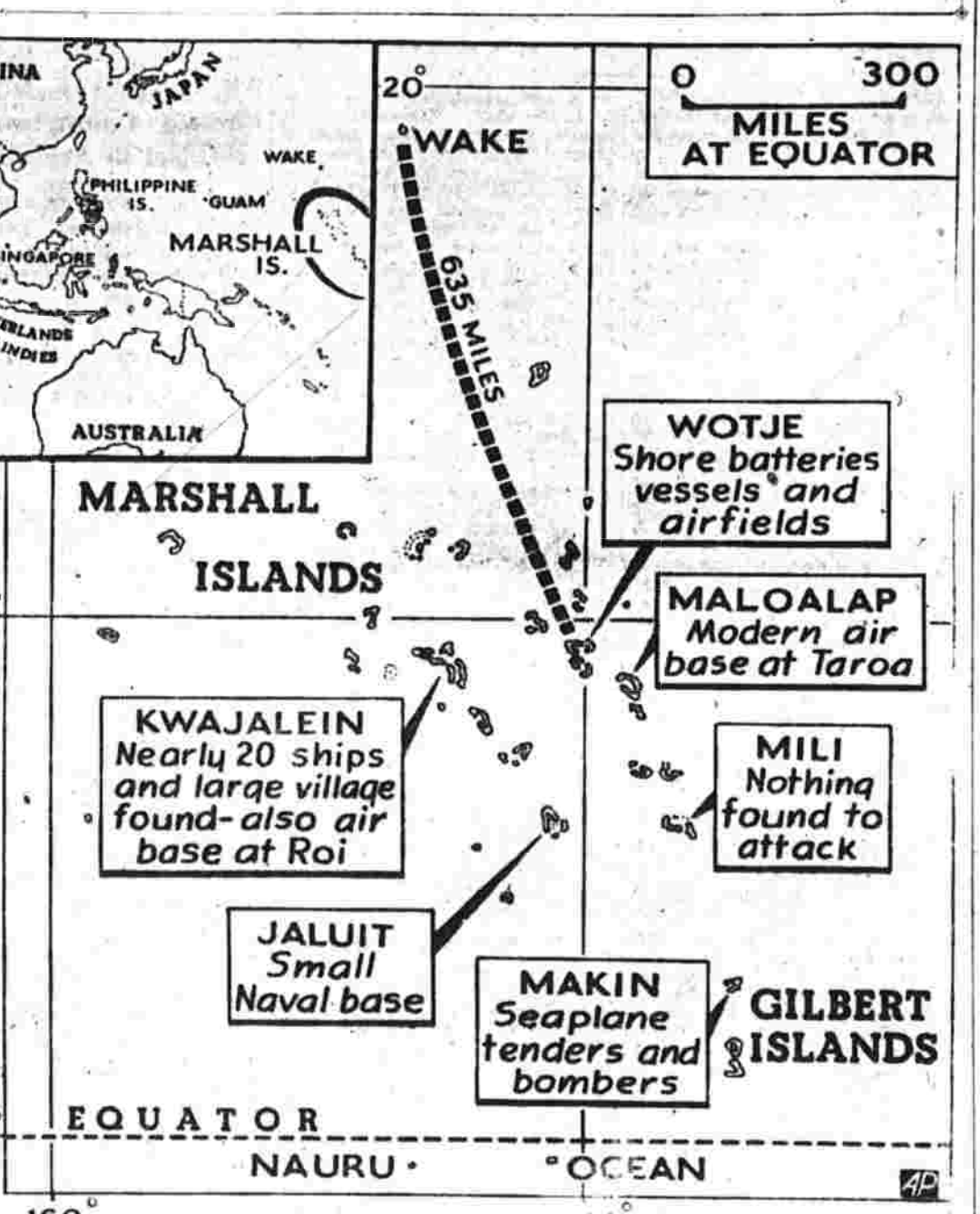
