He had long nurtured the hope of emancipating his country from the yoke of Spale and on July 16, 1809, led a small band of patriots in a coup d'etat in La Paz which successfully ousted the Spanish authorities. Murillo was chosen head of the new government and patriot officials were installed in administrative positions. Independence was proclaimed, but it was not long before Spanish troops, sent from Peru, restored the authority of the Crown. Overwhelmingly outnumbered

the patriots were defeated at Chacaltaya, in October, 1809. La Paz was occupied and Murillo met death at the hands of the vengeful Spaniards and Murillo
