### Coast Guard Aides Formed

#### Organizing Units for Patrol Along the Connecticut Shore Line.

New York, N. Y., March 14.—The United States Coast Guard has announced plans for forming volunteer flotilla units for patrol along the Connecticut shore line. Plans call for the enrollment of owners of suitable craft for patrol, and the formation of a Connecticut coast guard patrol.

Members of the Coast Guard Auxiliary are on a voluntary basis. While there are no compulsory duties or activities, it is a matter of devotion of much time. Originally a peacetime organization, the auxiliary has four major purposes:

1. To cooperate with the Coast Guard in the performance of certain of its duties.
2. To further interest in safety at sea and upon navigable waters.
3. To promote a better understanding of the Coast Guard and its regulations relating to motorboats and yachts.
4. To promote wider knowledge of navigation and operations of motorboats.

To date the established Coast Guard Auxiliary units in the several states have received training courses for yachtsmen wishing to further their knowledge of a variety of maritime subjects. The basic unit of the Auxiliary is the flotilla consisting of not less than ten boats and ten members. Membership in the Auxiliary is open to citizens of the United States who are at least 18 years of age. The Coast Guard regards a motorboat as any documented or numbered vessel propelled by machinery and not more than 65 feet in length. It also considered any documented or numbered vessel used exclusively for pleasure, over 16 feet in length, and not more than 65 feet in length, and not over the deck, not including the sheer, persons, equipment, or other boats may become Associate Members of the Auxiliary.

Each flotilla in the Auxiliary is to be headed by an elected flotilla leader, a Vice Commander and Junior Commander. Applicants for membership are examined by a committee of flotilla members and may be accepted or rejected, subject to appeal according to regulations. Each applicant must pass a two-part examination. The first section is designed to establish the personal competence of the applicant in the handling and operation of vessels. The rules of the road, the buoyage system of the United States and the navigation laws applicable to his vessel. The second part of the examination consists of an inspection of the applicant's boat to establish its seaworthiness and to ascertain that it is properly equipped with suitable safety and signaling devices. An Associate Member must pass the first part of the examination.

Since wartime conditions have placed additional responsibilities on the regular Coast Guard Auxiliary, it is anticipated that well equipped flotilla units will be organized. The flotilla units will take over some of the police and patrol duties during the summer months. To that end, the regular Coast Guard Auxiliary is being organized into flotilla units. Van Mook predicted the Japanese would attempt to consolidate their present holdings by a conquest of New Guinea. He added they might possibly try to invade northern Australia but would not throw their resources into a general Australian-New Zealand attack.

high prices being paid for labor" and "the prevalence of strikes were retarding the war effort."

Secretary Perkins said that last month 47,830 man-days were lost by 14,850 workers, compared with 10,660 man-days lost by 2,410 workers in January.

She said none of these strikes was authorized by national unions and most of them were short.

Urging caution in any restrictive labor legislation, Mead said he was informed by the War Labor Board that not a single new defense strike had been certified since the group was formed recently.

Senator Thomas said in his letter to Nelson and other officials that Congress and the administration were being attacked by "a group of unscrupulous and unscrupulous persons."

These included complaints that 17,000 shipbuilders were idle in California because of a shortage of ships, that machines and tools were idle in defense plants eight to ten hours a day and that defense strikes were increasing.

Thomas said Congress members were being asked why men were not drafted for defense industrial work, why many workers were required to join unions before they could get war plant jobs, why it was necessary to pay overtime for any war work and why plants could not be operated around the clock.

"I don't endorse all of these complaints and I don't believe all of the charges are true," Thomas told reporters. "But I want to get the facts on the official record so the people can know what is going on."
