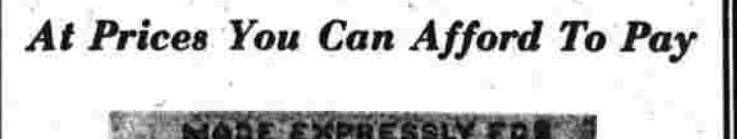

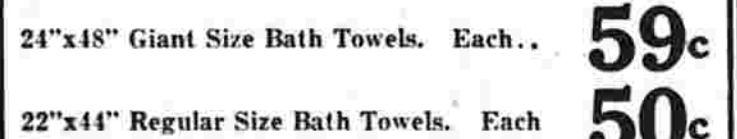

Washington, March 17.—(AP)—The arrival of Gen. Douglas MacArthur in Australia to assume the supreme United Nations command in that region was announced today by the War Department.

The assignment of General MacArthur was made at the request of an Australian government. His wife and small son accompanied General MacArthur and members of his staff on the plane trip to Australia.

Qualified quarters in London said the battle was likely to settle the question within the next two weeks whether Adolf Hitler would retain his forward jumping-off bases for a spring offensive.

In this connection, however, it should be recalled that the first draft lottery, involving about 9,000 numbers, required 18 hours. Men who registered February 16 have been assigned serial numbers by the local board. These numbers begin at "171" (17 denotes the first registration) and run to "17172."

The order in which the captioned numbers are drawn will be in the past, determine the order of liability for service. Each registrant will be assigned an order number in the order in which the order numbers will run from 10,000 to 15,000, since total numbers of the first two lotteries approximated 10,000.
