The Transylvania question has been a sore spot between Rumania and Hungary ever since the end of the First World War. When the territory was incorporated into Rumania, its transfer back to Hungary by the Vienna conference was one of the principal factors leading to the abdication of King Carol of Rumania in 1940.



We heard recently that residents of school time were due to the same reason. In Hebron are incensed over what happened to the waste paper that the Boy Scouts collected through the town. Seems that they called a nearby dealer plant, but we have been told that one teacher for one reason or another couldn't find time to give any of her class members study help after school hours. A couple of cities in the state turned up investigations because parents complained their sons and daughters reported teachers falling to sleep in class. It developed these teachers were working elsewhere and reporting to school pretty much tired out.

Somewhat we can't find the heart to be too critical of such efforts. Aren't we all being told we must double or triple to win the war? And we are also being told we probably will be drafted for war work. If a teacher should fall asleep in class—well, we know a couple of kids who wouldn't complain.

We have been wondering which of the milk dealers in town had to make re-deliveries on about 1,600 quarts of milk within the past week. Seems that in some way other some disinfectant got into a batch of milk and had been discovered. So the dealer quickly retraced the route and made deliveries of uncontaminated milk to his customers. It is said that the taste was not affected and the milk would not have harmed anyone, but the dealer was too careful to take any chance.

We heard a group of women remarking the other day on the condition of the rubbish depositories in the business section. One of the women said she didn't know which was worse, the litter on the streets or the looks of the rubbish cans. These metal containers have been on the streets now for several years, and between the vandalism of youngsters and the tumpers of parking automobiles, most of them are pretty much damaged. One day this past winter when there was quite a snowfall a local man's car was stalled against the curb on Main street. The only way he could get away from the curb was to drive up over it. In so doing he aid against one of the rubbish depositories and crushed it against a utility pole. He didn't pay any attention to what he had done. Similar accidents have taken place on many of the rubbish cans and they certainly look it.

We pass the suggestion along to the Town Fathers that it might be well to get a new supply of these containers before Old Man Priority makes it impossible.

"Spots" Zanlungo, proprietor of the Oak Street Grill, did a nice job of timing on his souvenir portraits of General MacArthur. He ordered a large shipment of the pictures over three weeks ago. They arrived the day the news broke of General MacArthur's great trip from Bataan to Australia, where he assumed command of the United Nations forces. So "Spots" distributed the fine pictures to his customers just as though he knew what was going to happen all along. Too bad he couldn't have had such good hunches at Hialeah.

A Bissett street family is being blamed unjustly for an incident that was reported in these columns following the test blizzard here. The mother was busy up stairs making beds and could not answer the door when an assistant warden knocked. The radio was on and this, too, made it difficult for her to hear. This same family is well represented in national defense. The husband served two trips in the army, one during World War I, and they are paying \$5 weekly towards defense bonds purchases. We hope that those so-called neighbors of this family will realize that they are good Americans and will stop the offenses they have been in the habit of committing against them.

We have been hearing a lot of complaints about the failure of bus drivers to make local connections. A group of residents in the Buckland section are the most recent to tell us about the trouble. If you miss a bus at Depot Square it means losing an hour or else walking.

The Buckland folks said that their real complaint is over their children missing connections and arriving home or reaching their destinations late. Many of them have children who come from Buckland into town to take various kinds of lessons, or to do some family errands. Many times bus drivers have driven away from a connection point just as passengers were crossing from another bus.

We have seen for ourselves how thoughtful some of the drivers are. We have seen the cross town and Green buses drive up with the Rockville bus just coming to a stop at Depot Square. Wednesday afternoon at 4:10 P. M., a lame, elderly woman carrying a cane tried to stop a northbound bus in front of the Woolworth Five-and-Ten. The bus had stopped at Birch street, but the woman couldn't get down there in time to catch the bus, so she stepped into the highway and waved her cane. The driver all but ran the woman down. He must certainly have seen her, but he didn't stop.

Connections at the Center are bad, oftentimes because the drivers don't look to see if the passengers have all arrived from the other buses. Now the drivers perhaps have as many complaints they could make about the behavior of passengers, but passengers are their stock in trade and they should take care of them.

Misplacement of labor during the vital defense efforts of this nation, is one of the main reasons, that this country is not establishing a maximum of production at the present time, according to authorities. Probably no case better exemplifies this than one which happened a couple of weeks ago to a local resident. It seems that during the last war, this fellow was a machinist's helper in one of the factories in Hartford. He did all right for himself during those days and succeeded in learning, he thought, all of the principles of the machinist's trade. After the war, when all of the defense factories folded up, he came back to town, and managed to obtain a job in the Cheney mills.

He was placed in a department in the old mill, and got along all right in his own particular way. After having spent some 20 years in this one department, he was considered as one of the best workers in the room. Then came the second World War. This fellow began to grow restless, and told his work fellows that he should be in that same factory in Hartford again. He hesitated somewhat, in acting on his thoughts, but finally, he weakened, and went over to the employment office in Hartford, and managed to assure the superintendent that he knew all of the principles of the modern lathe, reamer, drill press, or what have you. He was immediately placed in a position in the factory, and told to report for work the following morning.

Complete with uniform and lunch pail, this poor mechanic walked into the defense factory the next morning, and reported to his super. He was led over to a large drill press, handed a set of blueprints, and told to go ahead and complete the job. The smile on his face fell, and he stared with open mouth at the super. "I wouldn't know how to do all this," he stated with a weak voice. "But you said that you were a first class machinist, didn't you?" the super replied. It didn't take more than five minutes for the local man to put on his hat and coat, and make a shamefaced departure from the room, and factory. He reported back at work in Cheney's next morning, regardless of the jeers which his fellowmen at Cheney flung at him. We hear that he has contentedly settled down to his old job, and he no longer tells how he won the last war as a master mechanic.
