Washington, March 27.—(AP)—Divorcees were breaking all records before the war, the Census Bureau said today.

Nurses' Aides Are Training

Sixteen of First Class Now Working Daily in Memorial Hospital.

A class of 16 Manchester women are working various hours each day at the Manchester Memorial hospital assisting the nurses. They have attended a series of lectures held at the clinic given by a graduate nurse and are qualified to assist in the sick room. They arrive at the hospital about 8 o'clock in the morning and are assigned to different wards where they help the nurses in making of beds, through to all other duties in the hospital.

The women are to give 150 hours of this kind of service and when they have finished their hospital training they will return to their former occupations.

When the course is completed they will be qualified to take charge of emergency work in the different first aid rooms and emergency hospitals that will be later opened in Manchester. All of those who are doing this kind of work are women under 50 years of age and they are doing good work as evidenced by their letters from the hospital.

In several cases the women are working six hours each day for five days a week and all seem anxious to get their 150 hours of training completed.

Fuel Oil Shortage Relief Is sought

Boston, March 27.—(AP)—Mayor Martin J. Tobin has urged the Washington today to press for relief of a fuel oil shortage report, threatening to close some New England plants working on war orders.

Tobin's trip followed appeals by fuel directors of the New England states to Petroleum Administrator Ickes to establish a program that would step up shipments to the six states.

Industrial plants in New England are carrying on a "hair-breadth margin" through deliveries by tank cars and other methods. J. C. Richdale, fuel oil coordinator for the Massachusetts Public Safety Committee, said last night.

He described the situation as critical, with Rhode Island plants the hardest hit.

Coolidge Book Collection Saved

Northampton, Mass., March 27.—(AP)—A collection of books and other articles used by Calvin Coolidge in the White House appeared undamaged today after a fire of undetermined origin swept a wing of historic Forbes library.

Fire Chief Thomas W. Hurley estimated damage at \$200,000. Hundreds of books were destroyed, including some in the collection of Clarence Hawkes, Hadley's blind poet and naturalist.

Boys discovered the fire yesterday afternoon in the rear of a stack of books and notified library employees. A general alarm was sounded and firemen confined the flames to the second floor, but smoke and water caused some damage to the lower floor.

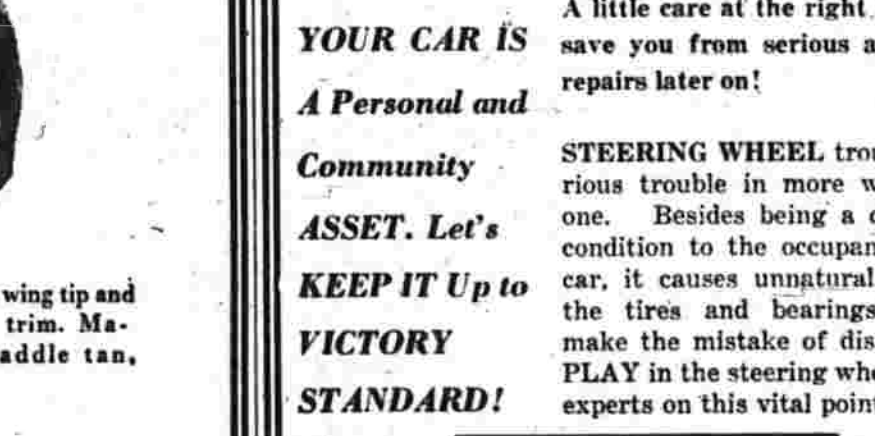
