Would Admit All Veterans

D. A. V. Chapter Approves Proposal for a New National Charter.

The David McCann chapter, D. A. V. met at the Army and Navy club last evening and approved an important resolution from the National Chapter relating to the change of name and a new national charter. The resolution calls for the inclusion of all disabled veterans from all wars, which would include World War No. 1.

At the present time the organization can only deal with veterans of World War No. 1 under its national charter. The resolution authorizes the present body to petition Congress for a change in name which would be, if approved, Disabled American Veterans. This means a lot to the men now in service.

The D. A. V. recognizes any veterans, whether they fought in foreign lands or were disabled at home. It maintains a service office at Washington and at every veterans' hospital throughout the country. The proposed change was adopted favorably here last night and the results of the voting were sent to national headquarters, via air mail today.

Indicate Town Balance Again

Standing of Appropriations Shows Finances Are in Good Condition

Chapters in Manchester for the first seven months of the year as shown by figures completed at the annual meeting last October, indicate that the town is in a good financial position. The standing of the different appropriations made by the town at the annual meeting last October and slightly changed in some cases at the adjourned meeting this month, has been an increase of \$3,000 in the highway account, due to an increase in wages for the most part, but also also because of the open year which made possible an increase in the highway account for the whole year. The cost of snow removal for the year is nearly \$4,000 less than a year ago. The town did not expend the \$7,000 that was budgeted for a new power plant, but it was bought for \$5,000. There was about \$1,000 less in other categories during the first seven months as compared with last year but street lighting, which was increased last year, amounts to nearly \$3,000 more than for the same period a year ago.

With the increased amount appropriated for schools it is estimated that as though the year would go on with the same amount as last year, the town would have a balance of \$15,000 to carry through for the remainder of the year and a half months. The position is up \$2,000, which would be a pay increase given to the men during the year and there has been spent \$500 more for the building inspector's office, but there will be good balance shown.
