





Key workers belonging to the independent union walked out Tuesday after the National Labor Relations Board denied the AFTO permission to organize the Fall River mills on a craft basis.

As the amount of material to be worked on dwindled, other workers were affected. An estimated 50 Brazil leads all nations in the labor unions.

A campaign to abolish the 40-hour week, he told a labor rally, "has been particularly prevalent in the less industrialized southern states, where anti-union employers have taken advantage of a lack of direct public knowledge of the labor movement to grind their own axes."
