Patent Seizure Order Speeds War Effort

Announcement of Presidential Action Hailed By Solons Probing International Pools.

Washington, April 22—America's war production effort burst through into new channels today under the impetus of a presidential order seizing all enemy-owned or controlled patents including German patents on the manufacture of synthetic rubber and oil.

President Roosevelt announced the seizure order yesterday at a press conference sandwiched in between a series of war councils with representatives of the United Nations.

May-Brandenburg Legislation The announcement, coming in the midst of a congressional investigation of international patent pools, was hailed in Capitol Hill by members of the investigating committee who said they might broaden proposed legislation to give the government greater control over patents.

Leo Crowley, alien property custodian, disclosed that the president's order already was being carried out—that researchers even were studying equipment and processes for making artificial rubber, just as food and drugs, biological and chemical equipment and machinery are being studied.

It was his idea, the president said, to seize patents held by Americans, but to be made available to all the United Nations.

Other White House callers included Dr. T. V. Soong, Chinese foreign minister, and other foreign officials who said "I think we all agree we are getting places."

Mothers Hope Sons Are Safe

Believe Other Members Of 200th Regiment Have Found Refuge.

Albuquerque, N. M., April 22—Word that 107 New Mexico Artillery men had reached Corregidor before the fall of Bataan raised hopes of mothers today that other members of the state's 200th Coast Artillery regiment may have found refuge elsewhere in the Philippines.

"It's wonderful news, but every mother only wishes she knew who their boys are in the service," said Mrs. Howard W. Meyer, president of the Mothers' Service club whose sons were with the anti-aircraft regiment.

While they say that the rest of the boys (there were more than 1,400 in the regiment) probably were taken prisoner, I have a strong feeling—and I know it's shared by other mothers—that

there might have been others," he said. Dr. V. H. Spensley, chairman of the newly-established Bataan relief organization, said "The news made all of us feel a little better and raised relatives' hopes that their kin was in the group."

That of 1,000 National Guardsmen on Bataan, only the 107 reached the island fortress in Manila Bay. The New Mexico regiment, was commanded by Col. C. G. Sage, Distinguished Flying Cross recipient. The other guard units were the 162nd and 194th tank battalions.

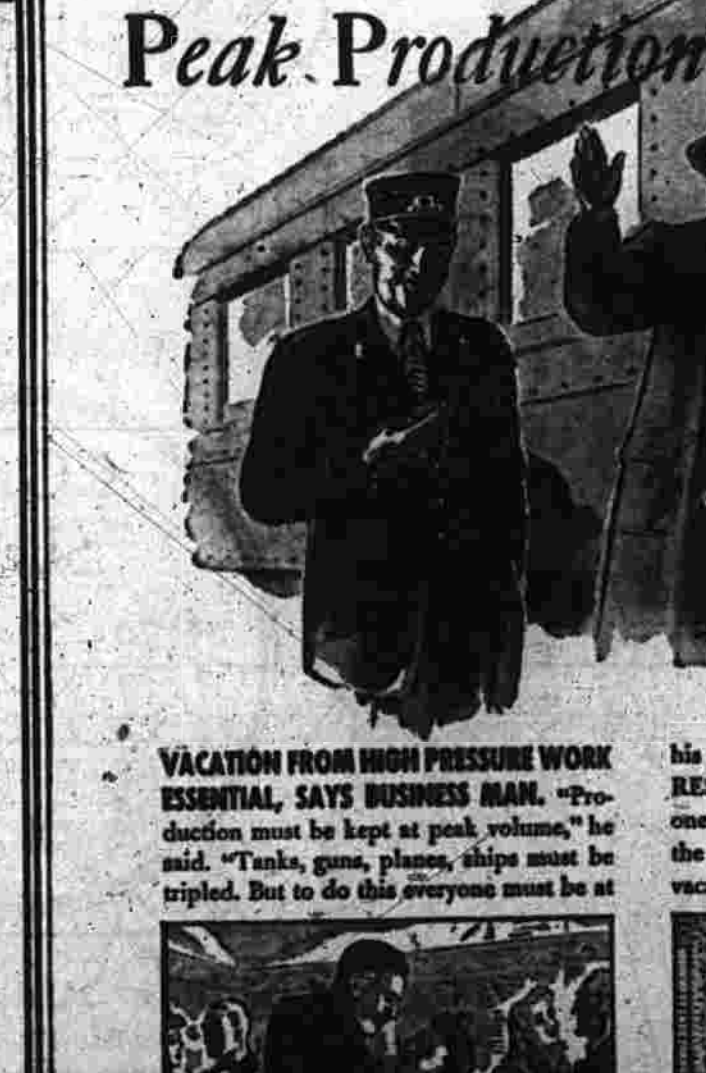

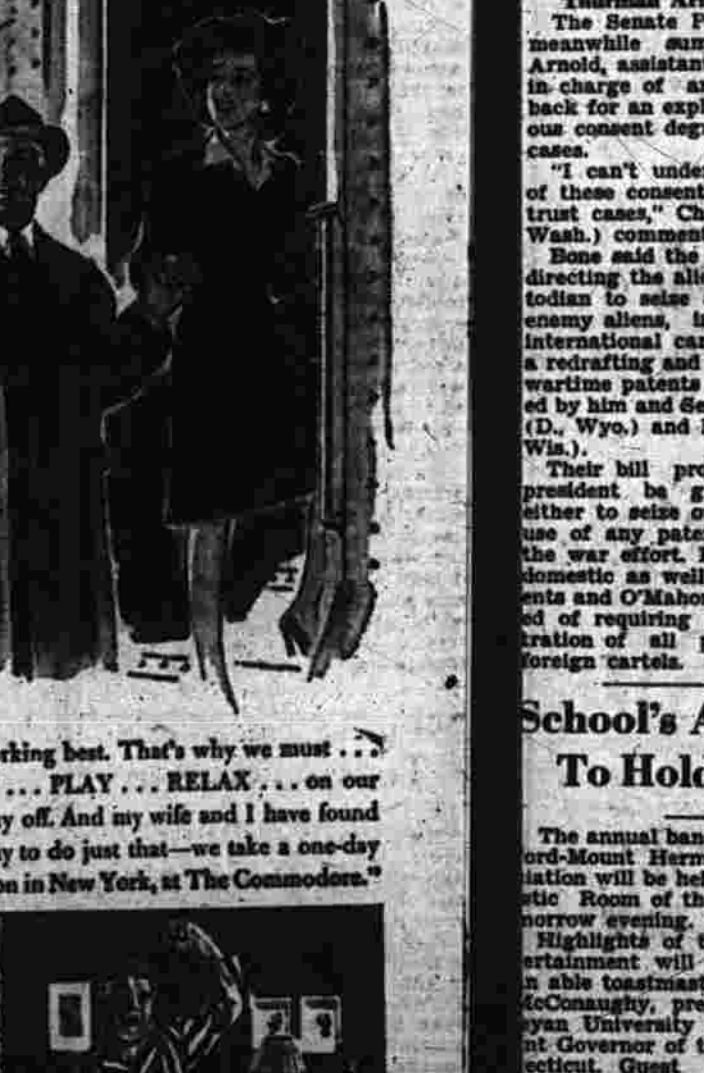

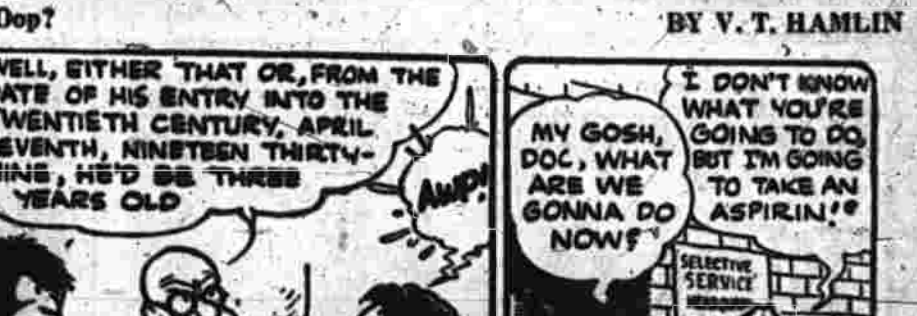
