Hartford, April 24—New claims or unemployment compensation took a sharp drop in March, for the second consecutive month, showing a decline of 21.5 per cent, State Labor Commissioner Cornelius J. Danaher announced today, with the decrease common to every town in the State excepting Danbury, Meriden and Middletown where local layoffs resulted in a slight increase.

According to James J. Graham, Acting Executive Director of the Employment Security Division, initial claims for unemployment compensation have shown a consistent decline since the first of the year, in spite of expected widespread unemployment due to conversion of factories to war industries.

"Claims in February took a precipitous drop of more than 45 percent, Mr. Graham stated, "and this trend has continued unabated, in spite of sporadic layoffs in some communities. Total benefits paid in March were \$324,008, a drop of 5 per cent over the previous month, while compensable claims showed a decline of more than 10 per cent, indicating that the ahiftover to war industry in this state is being made without undue dislocation."






