



Rostock Battered In Second Attack By British Fliers

More Than 400 Tons of Explosives Dropped in Two Attacks Which Surpass Anything Dealt Out to Britain by German Air Force.

London, April 25.—(AP)—Rostock was battered fiercely overnight in the R.A.F.'s second successive 1,000-mile round trip against the big German Baltic coast warplant and shipping center where the British declared today that more than 400 tons of explosives were dropped in the two attacks. The smashes at Rostock were said to have surpassed anything the German Air Force had dealt out to Britain.

Blast Aircraft Works
The Air Ministry said the British flew, striking in clear weather with a good view of their targets, blasted the Hestel Aircraft Works with heavy bombs and left huge fires burning from Rostock's principal shipyard.

This was one of a series of night operations which cost a total of three planes and 11 fliers. Squadron leaders took to the air again by daylight to strike at Nazi bases across the English Channel.

Rockets at Dunkerque were raised anew and air fields in France and the Low Countries were attacked by night by aircraft of the bomber and fighter commands, the Air Ministry said.

A coastal command bomber on patrol off the Norwegian coast was said to have bombed an enemy supply ship and set it afire.

Heavy Explosions Heard
British planes crossed and re-crossed Dover Strait in a haze today and heavy explosions and gunfire sounded from France—at times apparently from the areas of Calais, Boulogne and Dunkerque.

The new attack upon Rostock—a marshalling point for Nazi war supplies—drew from the Star the comment:

Beneath an excellent weather, the British fliers were said to have hit with particularly good effect at the Hestel plant.
