

I wish I could write about some of the secret gadgets we are using—about their effectiveness.

Most of our fighting men dislike convoy work because it is slow and tedious, because one can't run too far after the enemy. The troops and supplies are the first thought. Convoying is purely a defensive maneuver, and our men and boys prefer the offensive.

The sailors spend most of their time working.

Daily programs are planned in advance and printed copies are distributed the night before.

Fire and collision drills, abandon ship drills and battle problems are practiced with diligence.

One recent battle problem stated that an enemy cruiser had been sighted. While the gunners simulated an attack, our ship was struck by a "torpedo" on the starboard side and enemy planes began raining imaginary bombs on us.

Sham action, fast and furious, followed as we conducted offensive and defensive work.

These problems embrace every conceivable thing that can happen to a fighting ship.

Our guns are manned 24 hours a day by alert crews who also ald in the watch for submarines—for the telltale feather of a torped and the sight of a questing peri-

and the sight of a questing periscope.

Loading crews for the guns keep up a constant clatter as they to a shells around.

Other gangs are constantly at work—painting, chipping rust, swabbing decks, splicing rope and sable. Loafers are taboo.

Up on the various bridges officers work continuously, plotting the course, signagging the ship, watchin gfor signs of the enemy.

Our flery, nimble little skipper has deserted his sumptuous quarters on the main deck to live on the navigation bridge for the duration of the voyage. He rarely sleeps and then only in short naps. His meals are hurried and mostly unfinished.

Reports of submarine activity flow in continuously. Each is checked and proper action taken. Our own devices and gadgets on the destroyers bring in such reports and we go after the underest raiders hammer and tongs.

In the midst of this furious activity one can look to port and starboard and see a mighty array of transports and supply vessels on their way to war posts.

They offer an inspiring sight as they pitch and roll onward.

In spars time our crewmen enjoy movies with that old American spirit of "dama the torpedoes." They read books and magazines and the ambitious boys study for promotion.


