



Washington, May 1—(#)—A decrease in the number of workers being laid off by curtailment of consumer-goods manufacture and plant change-overs to war production was indicated today in the monthly report of Security Administrator Paul V. McNutt on unemployment insurance payments.

March memployment benefits amounted to \$43,000,000, or eight per cent more than February, but McNutt said both initial and waiting-period claims resulting from recent lay-cuffs dropped for the second successive month.

7:00 A. M. SATURDAY, MAY 9TH.

I. Hereafter, two air raid warnings will be sounded:

- 1. The first alarm will consist of the sirens only. This will be known as the "Mobilization Alarm." On the sounding of the Mobilization Alarm, Wardens, Auxiliary Firemen, Auxiliary Policemen, rescue trucks, ambulance units, and all A. R. P. Services will report to their posts. The Mobilization Alarm will be sounded when the Report Center receives the Yellow Signal. Traffic will not be stopped on the Mobilization Alarm. The Mobilization Alarm will also serve as a warning to the Town that the actual Air Raid Warning is to follow shortly thereafter. 2. The second alarm will be the regular Air Raid Red Signal consisting of





Hartford, May 1—(P)—Like any other landlord, the Hartford Housing Authority may have to cancel rent increases ordered for 26 families living in two of its projects when federal rent control becomes effective here June 1.

The authority disclosed today that increases ranging from \$4 to \$8 a month were imposed on the families who are receiving higher incomes than when they moved into Nelton Court or Dutch Point Colony. The raises were ordered in accordance with the graded zent schedules adopted by the authority, based on family incomes.




