THE TOWN OF MANCHESTER WILL HOLD AN AIR RAID TRIAL SOME TIME BETWEEN 7:00 A. M. MONDAY, MAY 4TH AND 7:00 A. M. SATURDAY, MAY 9TH.

I. Hereafter, two air raid warnings will be sounded:

1. The first alarm will consist of the sirens only. This will be known as the "Mobilization Alarm." On the sounding of the Mobilization Alarm, Wardens, Auxiliary Firemen, Auxiliary Policemen, rescue trucks, ambulance units, and all A. R. P. Services will report to their posts. The Mobilization Alarm will be sounded when the Report Center receives the Yellow Signal. Traffic will not be stopped on the Mobilization Alarm.

The Mobilization Alarm will also serve as a warning to the Town that the actual Air Raid Warning is to follow shortly thereafter.

2. The second alarm will be the regular Air Raid Red Signal consisting of all the sirens and factory whistles. This alarm is the danger signal and will be sounded on the Red Signal. TRAFFIC WILL BE STOPPED.

3. The recall will sound at the termination of the raid.

II. 1. TRAFFIC. All traffic shall cease except on the following main thoroughfares: East Center, Center, West Center, Silver Lane Road, Main Street from Center to Depot Square, North Main Street to Oakland Street, Oakland Street to Town Line.

2. The public is requested to cooperate.


