Washington, May 5.—(AP)—The Army is building up to a strength of 4,000,000 men. The department is planning for the continuance of War Department powers to conscription officials as Army officers, Patterson pleaded with the House Military Committee today that the War Department is not in favor of legislation to prohibit the conscription of transient civilians as Army officers.



St. Paul's Rises from Debris

Quickly Capture French Artillery Battery in Forestalling Seizure of Vital Indian Ocean Outpost by Japanese; Start Pushing Across Island to Diego Suarez; Expect Jap Move.

London, May 5.—(AP)—British Commandos, Marines and infantry landed on the northern tip of Madagascar today, and a Vichy news agency broadcast that they were attacking the strong French Naval base of Diego Suarez from the rear while warships and squadrons of airplanes assaulted the harbor frontally.

London, May 5.—(AP)—British troops landed on the northern tip of Madagascar today, quickly captured a French artillery battery and raced toward the Naval base of Diego Suarez, forestalling seizure of that vital Indian Ocean outpost by the Japanese.

British Also Strike in Force at Stuttgart And Raid Docked of Nazi-Occupied Nantes; Fighters Speed Toward French Coast Today.

London, May 5.—(AP)—Great new R.A.F. bombers ranging as much as 600 miles over enemy territory attacked the huge Skoda Armament Works at Pilsen last night for the second time in ten days, struck in force at Stuttgart, a major manufacturing city in southwest Germany, and raided the docks of German-occupied Nantes, then resuming their day sweeps, R.A.F. fighter squadrons sped over the straits toward the results of the new raids, but in a formal statement pointing out that transportation facilities of other areas has been diverted, Davies warned that "it is quite possible that shortages of gasoline in other areas" from which such facilities are diverted.

London, May 5.—(AP)—British Air Force again has smashed forcefully at Japanese island bases above Australia and beaten off another enemy raid on Port Moresby, a communication outpost against a raiding squadrons of nine heavy bombers escorted by ten Zero Naval fighters. Four of the hit raiders were bombers, the communication and the Zero fighters were shot down.
