Nazis' Crimea Drive Dies Down Speedily; Battle Since May 8

Strong Air Support Reported by Germans for Fight on Kerch Peninsula; Military Circles Not Inclined to Describe Battle as Beginning of 'Spring Offensive' by Nazis.

Berlin (From German Broadcasts), May 12.—(AP)—The German high command announced today that a battle has been in full swing on the Kerch peninsula since German and Rumanian troops launched an attack May 8 with strong air support.

Japanese Make New Yunnan Area Attack; Bomb Two Jap Ships

Japan Apparently Still Paying Terrible Price For Defeat in Coral Sea; Possible Damage To Third Vessel Reported; Raises Count To 23 or 24 Ships In Eight-Day Period.

Allied Headquarters, Australia, May 12.—(AP)—Japan apparently still was paying a disastrous price today for her defeat in the Coral sea as General MacArthur's headquarters announced that Allied fliers tracking down scattered, hiding remnants of the great enemy invader armada and other ships had damaged two Japanese vessels.

The possible 24th Japanese casualty was a large tanker on which, the communiqué said, air raiders registered two hits or near misses in the Deboyne islands of the Loyalties group.

An Army spokesman said the Loyalties definitely were not occupied by the Japanese, explaining the enemy had landed a few stores and supplies from boats and planes.

Believes Air Raids Won't Beat Japan

Only Continual Series of Military Setbacks Will Shatter Morale, Episcopal Bishop Says.

San Francisco, May 12.—(AP)—Not bombing raids on their islands but only a continual series of military setbacks will shatter the morale of the Japanese people, and thus hasten the end of the war in the Pacific, believes the Right Rev. Henry H. George Tucker, bishop of New York and Virginia.

The Rev. Mr. Tucker, presiding bishop of the Episcopal church presiding party a century after at the start of the war, visited the country in 1923 and has revisited the country frequently.

Urge Speed On Handing Out Masks

British Admit 3 Destroyers Sunk by Nazis

London, May 12.—(AP)—The British Admiralty announced today that three British destroyers had been sunk by German bombers in the Mediterranean.

The destroyers were the Lively, Jachal and Kipling. Complement of the three ships were believed to total about 600 officers and men.

All Three Were New The Lively, 1,200 tons, having been completed in 1940, and the other two, each of 1,000 tons, a year ago.

Yesterday afternoon a force consisting of four of our destroyers was heavily attacked by German aircraft in the eastern Mediterranean," said the communiqué.

The Lively was first hit and sunk, and when the remaining three destroyers were subjected to further heavy attack the Kipling was sunk.
