Enlist for Naval Duty

Wide Sprinkling of Ages
And Wider Diversification of Skills and
Social Background.

(Editor's Note: Nearly 2,000 men of Connecticut have volunteered for Naval service through recruiting offices in this state since Pearl Harbor. Scores more are daily offering their services. Most of them are young and more adventurous but not a few are fellows who contains led recording middle. but not a few are fellows who couldn't let crowding middle years rob them of a chance to do their part affoat.

(Herewith is the first of a brief but intimate series of stories on naval recruiting in Connecticut with a look ahead toward what the future holds for volunteers eager to give their best to their country.).
