




Warehousing Vital Oil In wartime, warehousing is vital-oil for the nation's humming ma-chine. With factories producing night and day, the goods must be moved out fast. With overburden-

ed transportation lines hitting in-cvitable jogs and jerks, not all the goods can go directly to their goal. Somewhere, too, there must be a

The merchandise warehousemen's contribution to American
civilization is some 110,000,000
square feet of space—nearly four
square miles of fic.r. At present
this space is about 80 per cent filled. On the surface, there's plenty
of room for storing things.
The catch is that th. 20 per
cent of vacant space is not neatly
gathered together into separate
buildings marked "empty." Every
warehouse has some goods on warehouse has some goods on hand; most of them also have some room for nore goods. There might be plenty of vacant space in town, but a man with a big load of goods to store might not find a single warehouse that could handle this load.

That has been the experience of

Answer is to Peel Vacancies Their answer is to ge. all the warehousemen of each big city to pool their vacancies. Warehousemen of Kansas Cit already have organized an emer gency warehouse association to make full use of their space. Other make full use of their space. Other cities are studying the same plan.

Under the plan, spensored by the Office of Defense Transportation, a full-time director keeps a pooled account of all warehouse space in the city. A government agent in search of storage space takes his problem to the association, signs a single contract for storage and leaves it to the association to put the goods away.

Where necessary, the association can divide a single consignment of

of the country. Government experts say its general adoption will get them some 10,000,000 square feet of space to meet war needs.

Deduces Danger of Loss

"At the same time," remarks the ODT, "storage of materials and supplies in warehouses in different parts of a city reduces the danger of loss by fire or sabotage."

In the case of cold-storage, the war has brought up another problem. With America serving as the bread basket of the United Nations, an all-time high demand for refrigerated storage space is expected next autumn, because of increased production of perishable foods to meet military, civilian and lend-lease requirements.

For the needs of the moment, however, the freezers and the coolers are out of proportion. The bulk of America's refrigerated storage space is cooler space, kept at a temperature of 30 degrees, Freezer space, kept at zero temperature, is only 30 per cent of the total 372,800,000 cubic feet of refrigerated space.

Cooler mare is used to store

perature, is only 30 per cent of the total \$72,500,000 cubic feet of refrigerated space.

Cooler apace is used to store fresh fruits and vegetables, eggs, cheese, lard and certain packing-house products.

Freezer space is used to store frozen fruits and vegetables, fresh meats, fish, poultry, frozen eggs and butter.

Besmand For Space Mounting

With increasing use of frozen foods, the demand for freezer space has been mounting in recent years. Wartime needs have added other demands for zero temperatures—mainly through the increased production of pork an other meat products, poultry, dairy products, eggs and other perishables to feed our fighters and our Allies. Shortage of tin came puts an added burden on freezer storage.

To meet the icebox shortage with as little new building of warehouses as possible, the government has asked the industry to convert about 11,500,000 cubic feet of space from cooler to freeze—a 10 per cent increase in freezer space.

The cost of changing over is not excessive, officials say, since many cooler plants can be made into freezers by adding insulation and pipe colls. In some cases, additional refrigeration machinery will be needed.

ODT is urging speedy work on the change-over to break the expected logism of food when the fail crops come in.

In wartime, warehousing is vital oil for the nation's humming machine. With factories producing night and day, the goods must be moved out fast. With overburdened transportation lines hitting inevitable jogs and jerks, not all the goods can go directly to their goal. Somewhere, too, there must be a backlog.

men's contribution to American civilization is some 110,000,000 square feet of space—nearly four square miles of flc.r. At present this space is about 80 per cent filled. On the surface, there's plenty of room for storing things.

The catch is that the 20 per cent of vacant space is not neatly gathered together into separate buildings marked "empty." Every warehouse has some goods on hand; most of them also have some room for nore goods. There might be plenty of vacant space in town, but a man with a big load of goods to store might not find of goods to store might not find a single warehouse that could

nandle this load.

That has been the experience of government agents. Answer Is to Pool Vacancies Their answer is to ge. all the warehousemen of each big city to pool their vacancies. Warehousemen of Kansas City already have organized an emergency warehouse association to make full use of their space. Other

make full use of their space. Other cities are studying the same plan.

Under the plan, sponsored by the Office of Defense Transportation, a full-time director keeps a pooled account of all warehouse space in the city. A government agent in search of storage space takes his problem to the association, signs a single contract for storage and leaves it to the association to put the goods away.

Where necessary, the association can divide a single consignment of goods into parcels for storage in several different warehouses. Sponsors claim the plan will mean fuller use of the warehouse space.

fuller use of the warehouse space of the country. Government experts say its general adoption will get them some 10,000,001 square feet of space to meet war needs.

Deduces Danger of Less

"At the same time," remarks the ODT, "storage of materials and supplies in warehouses in different parts of a city reduces the danger of loss by fire or sabotage."

In the case of cold-storage, the war has brought up another problem. With America serving as the bread basket of the United Nations, an all-time high demand for refrigerated storage space is expected next autumn, because of increased production of perishable foods to meet military, civilian and lend-lease requirements.

For the needs of the moment, however, the freezers and the coolers are out of proportion. The bulk of America's refrigerated storage space is cooler space, kept at a temperature of 30 degrees. Freezer space, kept at zero temperature, is only 30 per cent of the total 372,800,000 cubic feet of refrigerated space.

Cooler space is used to store

perature, is only 30 per cent of the total 372,500,000 cubic feet of refrigerated space.

Cooler space is used to store fresh fruits and vegetables, eggs, cheese, lard and certain packinghouse products.

Freezer space is used to store frozen fruits and vegetables, fresh meats, fish, poultry, frozen eggs and butter.

Demand For Space Mounting With increasing use of frozen foods, the demand for freezer space has been mounting in recent years. Wartime needs have added other demands for zero temperatures—mainly through the increased production of pork an other meat products, poultry, dairy products, eggs and other perishables to feed our fighters and our Allies. Shortage of tin cans puts an added burden on freezer storage.

To meet the leebox shortage with as little new building of warehouses as possible, the government has asked the industry to convert about 11,500,000 cubic feet of space from cooler to freeze—a 10 per cent increase in freezer space.

The cost of changing over is not excessive, officials say, since many cooler plants can be made into freezers by adding insulation and pipe coils. In some cases, additional refrigeration machinery will be needed.

ODT is urging speedy work on the change-over to break the expected logism of food when the fall crops come in.
