

Unable to Make Profit

Brown explained that ceilings fixed by Price Administrator Leon Henderson in general price-fixing orders were such that the producers, processors and distributors of these crops could not sell at these levels and make a profit.

In addition to the CCC authorization, the RFC would be permitted to pay subsidies on non-agricultural products.
