First Definite Statement Gaining significance in view of the current discussions of high ranking American Army officers with British officials in London, Marshall's assertion that American forces will land in France was the first definite statement by an American official that a ground offensive would be launched in the near future.

Marshall recalled that prior to Dec. 7, members of Congress, including the Joint Committee on the Organization of the Army, were of the opinion that the United States would not be drawn into the European war.

Some Federal courts have held differently, however. In San Francisco, Bridges, who has denied any connection with the Communist party, said Biddle's order was arbitrary and statements, prejudice and perjured testimony which have characterized the entire case.

He telegraphed Donald Nelson, war production chief, a pledge to "do all possible to offset any effect it might have on the production program and labor unity."

"I ask the American workers not to permit a weakening in any respect in our national unity. Now is the time, as never before, for greater production of arms and equipment for our men in the fighting forces."

Welcomed on Capitol Hill Biddle's opinion, generally regarded as a surprise, was welcomed on Capitol Hill.

Chairman Van Nuys (D-Ind) of the Senate Judiciary Committee called it "a very wholesome order." Senator George (D-Ga.) said "the country will be gratified."

Senator Clark (D-Okla.) and Representative Michener (R-Mich.) questioned the order's constitutionality. President Roosevelt's recent communication of the passport fraud sentence of Earl Browder, former general secretary of the Communist party, Browder was freed, the president said, in the interests of "national unity."

Commenting that the order "should be received as good news by the American people," Chairman Hayden (D-N.C.) of the Senate Military Committee said: "Bridges' Go Alike."

"Mr. Bridges should not be allowed to make the trip home these. There are thousands of out and out Communists here who would be rounded up and deported or held in concentration camps until we get rid of them."

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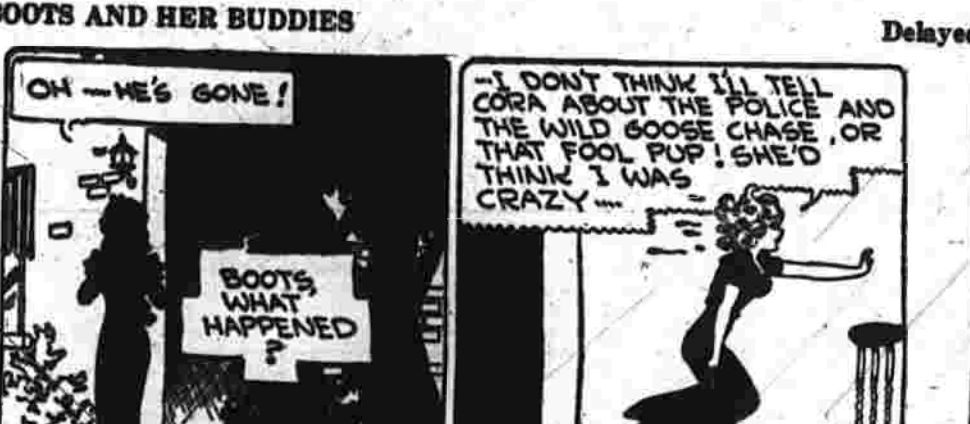
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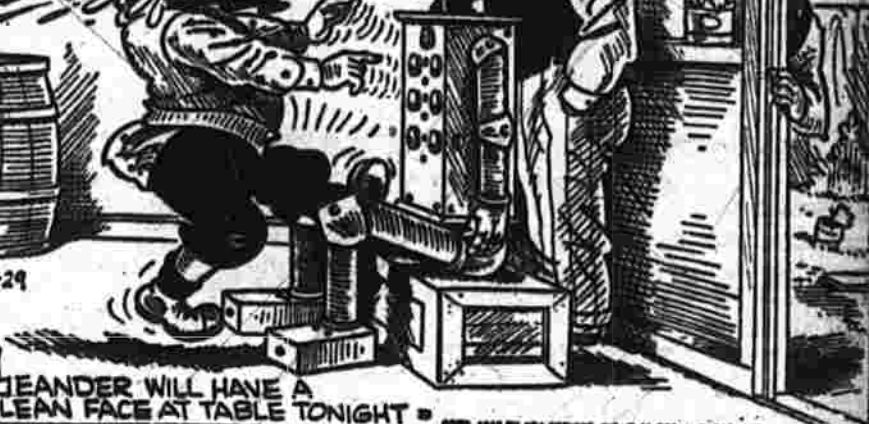

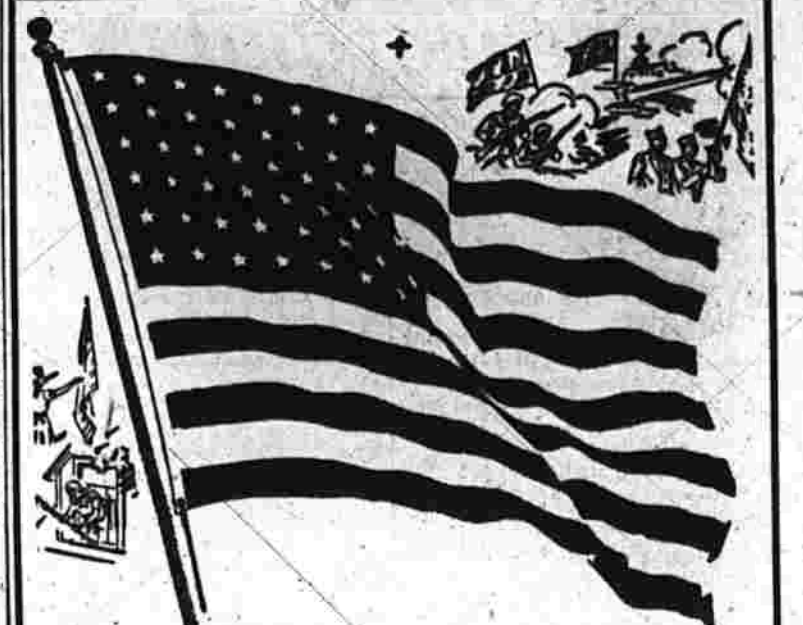
