



Washington, June 3.—(#)—An \$8,300,000,000 measure authorizing construction of approximately 500 fighting ships —a gigantic program which would come close to doubling the size of the United States fleet—was drafted today by Chairman Vinson (D., Ga.) of the House Naval Committee.







Dutch Indies Natives Loyal to Allied Cause

Dorothy Ritz

To Quit Post

Miss Dorothy Ritz, who for more than two years has been assistant to the minister of the South Methodist church and parish secretary, terminated her duties at the church yesterday, having submitted her resignation in April.

Always Smasshed Equipment Whenever they were forced to leave a post, Warners said, the Japanese always smasshed their equipment or carried it with them to prevent it falling into the hends of the enemy.

"There were hundreds of examples of courage and loyalty and honesty under the most trying circumstances," Warners recalled.

There was the native clerk in a Borneo post office who was ordered to take 200,000 guilders (more than \$100,000) to Java, a journey over sea and land of more than 800 miles.

Alone, the Indonesian struggied for five days through the jungle ahead of the invading Japanese to the nearest point of transportation.

"To make things worse for him," the colonel said, "when he stopped at an oil field on his way to Java, the settlement manager told him he needed 5,000 guilders to pay the salaries of his employes.

Japanese Expected To Resume Attacks

The Japanese still are trying to find out where Brig. Gen. Jimmy Doolittle and the other Tokyo raiders came from, and where they landed after their attack. Any ensmy attack against the west coast would, presumably, have to be carriec out by carrier-based planes. The bulk of Japan's military strength, according to the best available information, now is centered in Kores, Manchukuo and northern China—some 45 divisions of combat troops out of the total of between 100 and 110 which the enemy now is believed to have under arms. A Japanese division is said to number 11,000 or 12,000 men.

25 Divisions in Home Islands—Probably 15 divisions, of which two or six either are not fully equipped, are stationed in the home islands. In central and south China, where the Japanese now are most active, and on the Island of Formosa they have an estimated 10 to 12 divisions, with four in it. Philippines (compared to just least than 200,000 troops at the height of that campaign); a dozen in the Dutch East Indies and the adjacent islands, and 10 to 12 stread over Malaya, Indio-China, Thatland, Burms and Yunnan province in China.


