

Washington, June 9—(2)—Hearings on a \$2,807,499,740 supplemental war bill disclosed today that the Navy plans construction of 51 new submarines in the fiscal year beginning July 1, with 76 more scheduled for next year.

The testimony, before the Benate Deficiency Appropriations sub-committee, included a request by Rear Admiral A. H. Van Keuren, chief of the Bureau of Ships, for legislation releasing about \$30,000,000 of existing funds for the preliminary work.
