Washington, June 10.—(P)—
China's long and continuing fight against Japan will be commemorated with a special 5-cent stamp bearing a contour map of the country and two mottoes important in its modern history.

The stamp will be issued first at Denver, Colo., on July 7, Postmaster General Walker announced last night. It was at Denver that Sun Yat-Sen, founder of the Chinese republic, heard the news that the 1911 revolution against the Manchu regime had succeeded. July 1 will be the fifth anniversary of China's resistance to Japan.

Oval portraits of Abraham Lincoln and Sun Yat-Sen will flank the map, with the quotation "Of the people, by the pepole, for the people" in English and Chinese beneath the pictures. Bishops Resign is Protest
The Lutheran bishop of Calo and his six fellow bishops in other parts of the country resigned in protest against the Quisling regime. Specifically, they objected to the assault upon the deem of Drontheim, Fjelibu, whom a mob of Quislingites prevented from delivering his usual Sunday sermon. Some 9,000 tachers in individual setters resigned in March from the Teachers Federation when it came under Quisling control, thereby risking cancellation of their pensions, or rights to pensions, and being drafted for compulsory labor.




