



### Greeting Card Sales Will Boom This Year

Women are specially needed in tying cute little bows on cards, their fingers or their feminine touch being better than men's for such jobs. Cards should have not only a direct, personal appeal but should be tactful, particularly cards intended for mothers-in-law. 


