



New York, June 16—(Wide World)—Down in the canyon of Wall street slight, gray-haired James W. Gerard is looking ahead to the day when the war will end, and this is his formula for a lasting peace:

1. Break up the German Reich into impotent atoms which never can coalesce into another dangerous union.

2. Crush the spirit of conquest so completely that it never can rise again.

James W. Gerard

3. Maintain world peace with an international police force.

The 74-year-old former ambassador to Germany during the First World war has a fighting spirit undimmed by the passing years. To him, peace is something not only to be won—but to be guarded jealously by force of arms so that no nation can wage war on problem.

His office at 40 Wall street is near the spot where his grand-father, James W. Gerard, began his law practice in 1812 and where his father, another James W. Gerard, ca-ried on his law practice. Grandfather, father and son all obtained degrees as doctors of laws at Columbia university, a unique family distinction.

Gerard was educated in England, France, Switzerland and the United States, and began his law practice in 1890. Eighteen years later he was elected to the New York Supreme Court and in 1913 was appointed ambassador to Germany by President Wilson.

New Kind of Diplomacy.

Gerard took to his post a new kind of diplomacy characterized by bluntness and frankness. He carried out his duties so diligently that before the United States broke off relations with Germany he actually was approan non grata

Gerard warned the world for years of Germany's growing military might. Soon after Hitler came to power he sensed the war that to power he sensed the war that to german-American treaty of 1799

Advocated American Ald And then when his predictions came true, he advocated that the United States help wipe out the Nazi menace. Speaking before a Brooklyn Sunday school union assembly in 1940, Gerard urged immediate U. S. entry into the warnand added: "If eventually, why not now? We ought to be in this war. If not, we're cooked."

A few months later he was supporting the administration's aid to Britain bill and told a Senate committee: "Don't think that if Germany wins she is going to send a ship over here bearing garlands and flowers. They hate us."

If the Nazis keep a card index file on their special enemies, then the name of Gerard undoubtedly is high on the list, for the one-time diplomat has been unsparing in his personal campaign to arouse his people against the Hitler regime.
