Plastics Given Slight Setback by Warfare

Some of the important raw materials needed for direct war uses; advance retarded.

By James Marlow and William Flewover

New York, June 17—(Wide World)—Plastics, which really began with a hillbill ball when electrical tanks ran short, were now knocked slightly behind the eight ball by the war.

Some plastic plants are working at capacity in war production, while others are idle, which has a phenomenal growth in the 12 years preceding the war in the U. S.

The reason for some of the important raw materials needed for making plastics are needed more for direct war uses, such as the manufacture of explosives.

Findings Widening Field

But the industry nevertheless is finding a widening field for its production on the battlefield and counting on golden days when peace returns.

One leader of the industry recently said the production of plastics materially increased 60 per cent from 1929 to 1940 and is still going up today.

Although most of the current plastics output has been for war purposes, very little important new plastics have been developed in the past few months.

The great oil industry and the electrical appliances, pre-fabricated housing, office appliances, and wearing apparel such as rain coats, shoes and hats.

The industry lost civilian customers when the manufacture of automobiles and generators was cut off.

The Army and Navy are investigating the use of plastics in various places which often can take the place of metals. This might lead to greater wartime production.

There are about 3,500 firms in the industry—this includes all the steps in plastic making. Last year had a gross production of approximately \$500,000,000.

Gerard Would Break Up Reich After War

Favors Crushing Spirit of Conquest and International Police Force To Keep Peace.

New York, June 16—(Wide World)—Down in the canyon of Wall street slight, gray-haired James W. Gerard is looking ahead to the day when the war will end, and this is his formula for a lasting peace:

Break up the German Reich into impotent atoms which neighbor nations can control.

Crush the spirit of conquest so completely that it never can rise again.

James W. Gerard, 44, Wall street is near the spot where his grandfather, James W. Gerard, began his law practice in 1812 and where his father, another James W. Gerard, carried on his law practice. Grandfather, father and son all obtained degrees as doctors of laws at Columbia university, a unique family distinction.

Gerard was educated in England, France, Switzerland and the United States, and began his law practice in 1906. Eighteen years later he was elected to the New York State bar, and in 1913 was appointed ambassador to Germany by President Wilson.

Gerard took to his post a new kind of diplomacy characterized by bluntness and frankness. He carried out his duties so diligently that his superiors were made to break off relations with Germany he actually was persona non grata in Berlin.

He campaigned for better treatment of the German people in a series of lectures and articles. He was named to a special committee to provide comfort for them, and once threatened to resign his position as ambassador in protest of the German government's refusal to accept a document reaffirming a German-American treaty of 1923 with clauses favorable to Germany.

"I would stay here until Hell froze over before I would put my name to such a paper," he declared.

Gerard finally gave him a passport home where he recorded his experiences in two books, "My Four Years in Germany" and "Face to Face with Kaiserism". Gerard never doubted the interest in European affairs. He began to sign a document reaffirming a German-American treaty of 1923 with clauses favorable to Germany.

Gerard Would Break Up Reich After War

Favors Crushing Spirit of Conquest and International Police Force To Keep Peace.

By Don Whitehead

New York, June 16—(Wide World)—Down in the canyon of Wall street slight, gray-haired James W. Gerard is looking ahead to the day when the war will end, and this is his formula for a lasting peace:

Break up the German Reich into impotent atoms which neighbor nations can control.

Crush the spirit of conquest so completely that it never can rise again.

James W. Gerard, 44, Wall street is near the spot where his grandfather, James W. Gerard, began his law practice in 1812 and where his father, another James W. Gerard, carried on his law practice. Grandfather, father and son all obtained degrees as doctors of laws at Columbia university, a unique family distinction.

Gerard was educated in England, France, Switzerland and the United States, and began his law practice in 1906. Eighteen years later he was elected to the New York State bar, and in 1913 was appointed ambassador to Germany by President Wilson.

Gerard took to his post a new kind of diplomacy characterized by bluntness and frankness. He carried out his duties so diligently that his superiors were made to break off relations with Germany he actually was persona non grata in Berlin.

He campaigned for better treatment of the German people in a series of lectures and articles. He was named to a special committee to provide comfort for them, and once threatened to resign his position as ambassador in protest of the German government's refusal to accept a document reaffirming a German-American treaty of 1923 with clauses favorable to Germany.

"I would stay here until Hell froze over before I would put my name to such a paper," he declared.

Experiences Recorded in Books

Gerard finally gave him a passport home where he recorded his experiences in two books, "My Four Years in Germany" and "Face to Face with Kaiserism". Gerard never doubted the interest in European affairs. He began to sign a document reaffirming a German-American treaty of 1923 with clauses favorable to Germany.
