3 Allied Ships Prey of Subs Over 12 Days

Announced Loss of Two More Vessels Swells To 309 Total for Western Atlantic Area.

Wholesale death and destruction in the Atlantic Ocean during the last 12 days of the Spanish war was wrought by enemy submarines which over a 12-day period sank 13 United States merchant ships to the bottom of the Caribbean.

This was disclosed by the Navy yesterday on the blackboard of a press conference at the Navy Department since the war began, and with the announcement that the United States in the Atlantic swelled to 309 the total of Western Atlantic area sinkings.

Canadian ships, with 48 sunk, and 100 in the Caribbean, including the two announced today, were the 13 United States merchant ships.
