**Famous Football Coach
New Army Engineer
In Norfolk District;
Lot of Detail on Job.**

Norfolk, Va., June 30.—(Wide World).—The touchdown engineer "is figuring out bigger 'playing' boys—with blueprints and glass specifications."

Lieut. Col. Robert Reese Neyland still "is the same old Neyland" who knew him during his 11 years as football mentor at the University of Tennessee. Neyland is the States Army district engineer in Norfolk.

3 eggs and 2 egg yolks or 4 eggs slightly beaten	1 unbleached pie shell
	Grated nutmeg
	1 cup shredded coconut
