The writ further claims that on March 25, 1942 the plaintiff moved certain articles of furniture and equipment into the house, naming some 16 different items that were moved in, and that on March 31, 1942 when a truck arrived from his home in Rockville with additional household goods that Bowers would not allow them to be moved in and that the "defendant unlawfully, wontonly—and in a high handed manner" ordered the goods to be moved to a storehouse on Pearl street, al' without the consent of the owner. It is claimed that the between March 25 and June 6, 1942 the plaintiff was denied the use of his furniture and had to spend money to buy new furniture value by him at \$10,-000 and because of the failure to use the furniture he was further damage he says he incurred is the basis of the suit for \$15,000.


