

American people.

We are faced with a serious shortage of steel scrap; rubber and other vital materials. This shortage must be filled.

By "scrap" we mean the ordinary Junk which today is lying in the barnyards and in the gullies of farms; in the basements, attics and garages of homes and stores throughout the country.

The steel industry operates on the basis of half-and-half—about 50 per cent metal from pig iron and 50 per cent remelted scrap metal.

Therefore, about 50 per cent of every tank, every ship, every submarine and every gun is made of scrap iron and steel. production-from 67,000,000 tons in 1940 to a recordreaking 83,000,000 tons in 1941. Production in 1942 is already ahead of 1941, but we need to get production up to the industry's full capacity of 90,000,000 tons—a total equal to the output of the rest of the world combined.

This volume of production cannot be attained or in-

creased unless an additional 6,000,000 tons of scrap iron and steel is obtained promptly. We are faced with the fact that some steel furnaces have been allowed to cool down and that many of them are operating from day to day and hand to mouth, due only to the lack of scrap.

The rubber situation is also critical. In spite of the recent rubber drive, there is a continuing need for large quantities of scrap rubber. We are collecting every possible pound of scrap from the factories, arsenals and shipyards; we are speeding up the flow of material from automobile graveyards; we are tearing up abandoned railroad tracks and bridges, but unless we dig out an additional 6,000,000 tons of

steel and great quantities of rubber, copper, brass, zinc and tin, our boys may not get all the fighting weapons Fortunately, the material exists in America's great fimine above the ground.

Not Greatly Different
Tissue cells are not greatly different from germs. They absorb food, they breathe by taking in oxygen. So Memorial has been studying the foodstuffs in cancer cells to see whether they differ.

Chemical Job Enormous

Here again the chemical job is enormous. The cancer cells are so small that it takes a microscope to see them. The chemist has to discover what goes on in a single cancer cell, and decide how it differs from the doings inside a healthy one.

The third attack is not scientific, but just rule of thumb. There are hundreds of thousands of thousands of thousands of thousands of thousands of chemicals. Many are lethal to living tissues. Memorial is trying them, one at a time, on cancer. Seventy have been tried so far.

This is asfe because it can be done in glass tubes. Cancer cells, or cancer tissues, can be kept alive for months in a tube. So can normal tissues. The Memorial scientists feed the test chemicals to Liet tubes and watch for differences.

Affects Cancer Differently One type, of chemical, not further described, has been found which affects human breast cancer differently than it does healthy breast tissue. In the same concentration, it interferes with the health of the cancer but not of the breast.

This effect does not come from

a single chenical, but from a number of different ones, and in each case is due to a certain structure which is alike in all the chemicals.

"The results may have farreaching significance," the director declares." They prove apparently that there is a real difference between cancer calls and appara
