More Jap Vessels Sent Down Coast To Papuan Front

Ships Elude Allied Bombers; Believed to Carry Small Numbers Of Men and Supplies For Gona-Buna Area; Planes Strafe Patrols.

General MacArthur's Headquarters, Australia, Aug. 4.—(P)—The Japanese have sent more ships down the New Guinea coast to the Papuan peninsula, presumably with reinforcements for the Gona-Buna area, it was reported here today. These ships, which eluded Allied bombers, were believed to have carried only small numbers of men and supplies. The original force, which landed on the peninsula was estimated at between 1,500 and 2,000 men.

When the Japanese made their first landing in the Gona-Buna sector on July 22 the invasion force included two destroyers, two transporters, of which one transporter was sunk and two others hit.

Situation Unchanged
Allied headquarters announced today that the situation remained unchanged at Kokoda, about half-way across the island, three destroyers and five transporters, of which one transporter was sunk and two others hit.

Other Allied planes raided the area above Buna, yesterday and hit an enemy cargo ship. The Japanese communication cable was cut and a small boat was destroyed.

A separate headquarters announcement reported that a small transport escaped in an attack by a submarine, the first reported enemy submarine attack in this region since mid-June. Two of the transport's crewmen were killed and four injured.

The submarine came to the surface off the eastern coast of Australia within point-blank range of the trawler. Members of the submarine's crew could be seen on the deck in the moonlight, smoking cigarettes.

Seamen on the trawler tried to get into a lifeboat while the captain of the vessel shouted the craft was unarmed, and on a fishing cruise.

Two of Crew Killed
The Japanese did not hear or see the captain's shouts. The trawler was shelled and machine-gun bullets splattered among men trying to shove off with the lifeboat. Two of the crew were killed, four wounded.

Although hit by 12 shells the trawler remained afloat and the submarine sank. In 15 minutes it came up again to fire a salvo of machine-gun bullets. Hours later another trawler arrived.

Red Army Units Fall Back to New Lines; Voroshilovsk Taken

German Mechanized Units Reach Kuban River at Several Points—Important Industrial Center Taken After Fierce House-to-House Fighting; Bombers Attack Red Columns.

Berlin (From German Broadcasts), Aug. 4.—(P)—German mechanized forces have reached the Kuban river in the Caucasus at several points and captured the town of Voroshilovsk, 180 miles southeast of Rostov, the high command said today. A war bulletin reported that the town, described as an important industrial center, fell to the German attack after violent house-to-house fighting.

On Spur of Railway
Voroshilovsk is on a spur line northeast of the main Rostov-Baku railway and is 40 miles from the town of Rostov. The town is situated on the north-south Caucasus oil pipeline and a second pipe line that runs to the port of Tuapse on the Black Sea coast.
