Commando Tactics Used by Japanese To Make Landings

The committee, suspending its public inquiry for a day, studied the assertion of C. R. Starna, independent operator of Glendale, Tex., that representatives of the major oil companies, working inside the government and out, were in control of the synthetic rubber industry.

Starna's charges were supported by a letter from the Standard Oil Company, which stated that the "conspiracy" was being promoted by "certain interested parties" and that the "stragglers" have included a number of their own patent holders.
