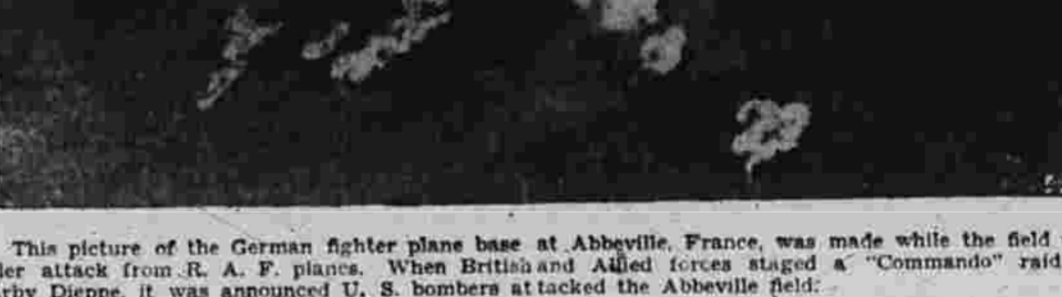
Reds on Initiative On 4 Key Central Fronts in Russia

Battles Develop Along 400 Miles from Bryansk to Lake Ilmen; Soviets Hold Doggedly Before Stalingrad and in Caucasus Area.

Moscow, Aug. 20.—(P)—The Red Army has taken the initiative in battles developing on four key central Russian fronts along the 400-mile line from Bryansk to Lake Ilmen while holding doggedly before Stalingrad and in the Caucasus, battifront dispatches reported today. Centers of the Russian attack were listed as the Bryansk-Calkin, 210 miles southeast of Moscow; the salient 150 miles west of Moscow in the Vyazma area; the Kalinin-Rubov salient, 130 miles northwest of the capital; and the Lake Ilmen front south of Leningrad.

people, at the moment, stand ready to do whatever is common sense and reasonable to make sure that the fuel supply will go around fairly.

Give them some uniform plan of conservation which seems fair and practical, and in which they can have confidence, and they will be friends of whatever regulation is necessary.

It is this psychology, which has come into the public attitude toward the gas and rubber problems, and which has resulted in the present situation, that we must understand if we are to have any chance of solving them.

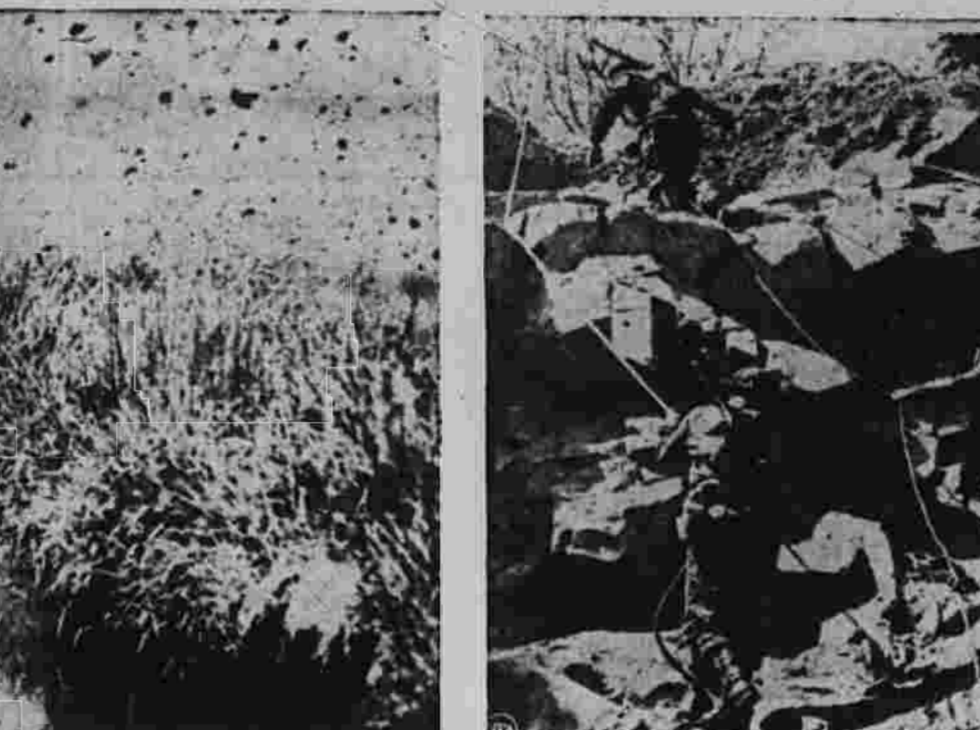

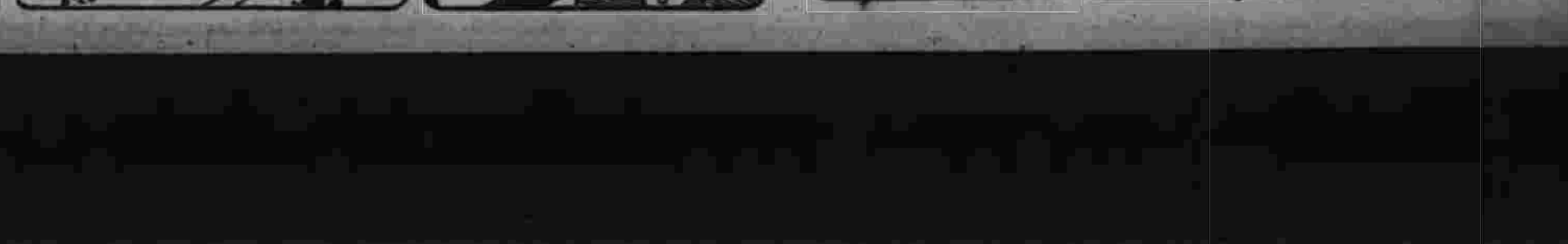

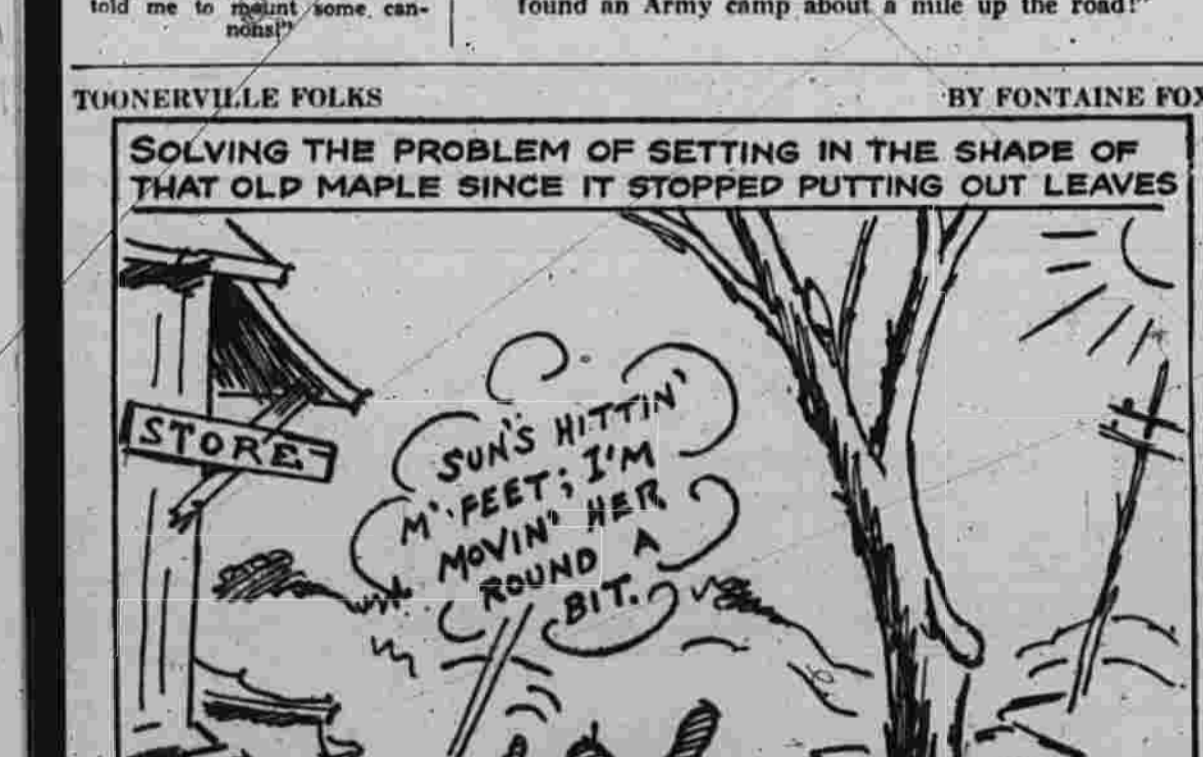
