Nonetheless, the anti-inflation problem was expected to highlight the address in view of his assertion that this was a very serious matter affecting lives as well as the progress of the war.

Sparking more plainly the war and farm price stabilization than at any time since his seven-point price control message to Congress on April 27, the president told his press conference that wages could not be stabilized without stabilizing farm prices. The president said the program had been made as simple as possible, and that it would be a fraction of one per cent. But something more would have to be done to make this permanent, he said, adding that as soon as price controls were lifted the whole program goes on dangerous ground.

At one point in his lengthy discussion, Mr. Roosevelt said the country was being torn apart by the battle between two groups—labor and agriculture—when as a matter of fact they were not two separate groups but all of them were Americans. All had to be treated as such, he repeated.

He agreed it was possible for farm costs to rise 20 per cent in a year, as Henderson said they might without proper controls, and asserted the objective of his plan would be to make that less likely.

Reminded by a reporter that agriculture Secretary Wickard had recently advocated repeal of legislation permitting farm prices to rise 100 per cent of party before ceilings were invoked, Mr. Roosevelt said that gave him an idea for a story. He then entered upon a long discussion of the close tie between farm and labor interests.

As to the average farm family, he said, it was not proper to say such a family lives off the farm, as it buys canned goods, clothing, and household needs in the store, and when the cost of such things go up the farm family is very deeply affected—almost as much as the city family.

He went on to say that if farm prices were held down to the level of living explained to them, they would appreciate conditions and go along with efforts to stabilize living costs.

Preparing to Run On Full Time Basis Washington, Aug. 26—(AP)—Administration leaders prepared to go to Congress functioning on a full time basis by Sept. 1 in an anticipation of a new front against Roosevelt outlining proposed price controls over the cost of living.
