Stakes in the Naval Battle

It is still too early to estimate the outcome of the battle at sea fought off the Solomon Islands yesterday afternoon.

That reservation of the victory claim, made in spite of the fact that the results to date are "encouraging," obviously mean that the Japanese, up to the time of the communique, had not given up their operations in the Solomons area.

Though the victory is not yet clear, we have been given good information to establish the probable significance of this battle.

The Japanese "launched this time before they responded to our successful invasion of their Solomons bases. When they came back, it was with relatively unimportant landing parties.

Probably important American ships too, it is a factor on our side that even though we were little more than a "straggler" in the use of Jap fields in process of construction, in establishing land-based air positions for this battle.

But although planes may be the factor which delivers the damage, the results of this battle will probably be measured in terms of sea power.

Pearl Harbor and Singapore led Japan to superior sea power in the Pacific. The battles of the Coral Sea and Midway together with the probable recommissioning of the fleet, have brought us back to an ordinary Englishman, titles and trappings subordinate to the fact that he loved his country.

Probably Hitler Secretary Morgenthau has announced that the August quota for purchase of war bonds will not be met. Asked why, he shrugged his shoulders.

"Whispered" The President chose his words well, when, at his Tuesday press conference, he said he felt that "the country is being whipsawed between the labor and agricultural groups."

He spoke more truth when he said that you cannot stabilize wages without stabilizing farm prices or stabilize farm prices without stabilizing wages.

And he spoke still more truth when he remarked that although the agricultural and labor groups have formed the habit of voting as blocs, they should really be all Americans having two big groups. And all Americans he said, go to make some money "pretty big amounts" before this war is over.
