Sees India Not Ready For Its Independence

Service Club Speaker Here Says Freedom to Be Granted When People Learn to Handle It

Great Britain is ready to grant India the kind of government the 13 provinces of that great country can formulate and sustain successfully, Henry S. J. Polak, former legal advisor to Mohandas K. Gandhi, told a joint gathering of service clubs of Manchester at the Masonic Temple last night. That India has not the freedom her leaders now claim to seek is the fault of the people and the leaders and not the fault of Great Britain, the speaker asserted.

225 Attend
Last night's gathering, the second of its kind held here, was attended by 225 members of the clubs and their wives or friends. Four service groups were represented, the Exchange Club which sponsored the affair, the Kiwanis Club, the Rotary Club, and the Chamber of Commerce. The speaker, Miss Helen Holbrook, president of the Interclub Council of Service Clubs, presided, and those introduced in addition to the principal speaker, were: May David (Chambers), Miss Helen Holbrook, Secretary; Mrs. J. W. Robb, head of Rotarians here; President Elmer A. Weden of the Kiwanis Club, and Dr. David M. Caldwell, head of the local Exchange Club.

Each brought the greetings of his respective organization and Mayor David Chambers, remarking that the speaker of the evening, planned to return to Manchester, Eng., with the hope that the English sister city would soon be enjoying again freedom from war.

Guests were present from Hartford, Windsor, and East Hartford, representing service clubs in those communities. Miss Marion Tinker and Mrs. Anna Wade, local County club caterers, prepared a fine chicken dinner in the Masonic Temple banquet hall beginning shortly after 6:30.

In opening his talk Mr. Polak said he had been in Dover, England, now called "Hell's Hall" because of the heavy bombing it had suffered. He said he was proud of Dover and the way it had recovered from the way it is being hit now.

India's peoples are very much devoted to whatever religion they have adopted and this in itself makes it difficult to arrive at a solution of their problems. The whole country is divided religiously. Despite the handicap this makes Britain has done wonders in bringing stabilized government, education and modernization to the country.

Mr. Polak said that he is generally asked two questions about India—first, is India in the war? and second, will Britain grant India freedom after the war?

India is definitely in the war, the speaker stated. A million and a half men are in war service, and recruiting is continuing extensively. India is really fighting with the United Nations, he said, and more than for Britain she is fighting for herself. India's soldiers are good soldiers and they present a formidable army which they have been well equipped by Britain and the United States.

India's labor faction has given a good account of itself in the war. Mr. Polak said in many instances India's industries are in direct competition with Britain's industries and Gandhi himself has on one occasion at least sympathized with the English workingman because of this competition. China is greatly interested, naturally, in the course India takes and has asked the people of India to cooperate with the United Nations. As to freedom for India after the war, Mr. Polak pointed out that before India's people can successfully handle freedom of government they must learn to accept responsibility. He said Britain has already expanded freedom of governmental action and responsibility to a great degree in India, but the people have not yet shown that they are ready to govern themselves.

Both Parties See Victory In Elections

Democrats Counter Republican Prediction of Winning Control of House in November

Washington, Sept. 30.—A Republican prediction that the party would win control of the House in the November elections was countered today by Democratic spokesmen who expressed the belief that Democrats not only would retain their majority but might increase it slightly.

The Republican speaker was Frank E. Gannett, assistant chairman of the Republican National committee, who told a party dinner last night that the country was in an "awful mess" from what he described as the "bungling of the war effort and under-achievement of the government." He predicted that Democrats would win control of the House in the November elections.

Can Check Folles
"If the voters in November will elect a Republican House, as I believe they will, then we can check the New Deal folles, get rid of the inefficiency in our government, prosecute the war more vigorously and hasten the happy day when our boys will come back home."

Rep. Jed Johnson of Oklahoma, head of the Speakers' bureau of the Democratic Congressional Campaign committee, told reporters at the Capitol: "We're hopeful of getting back at least as many members as we now have. Perhaps we can pick up a seat or two."

"I don't think there's the remotest possibility of a turnover which would give the Republicans a majority in the House," Gannett said. "Present membership of the House is: Democrats 256, Republicans 165, with minority parties and vacancies making up the remainder of the 435. A clear majority is 218. On the present basis, the Republicans would have to capture more than 50 Democrats' seats and not lose any of their own to win a majority."

Johnson said there were about 40 Democrats and as many Republican incumbents who won in 1940 by a margin of 500 votes or less. "Those seats are all in the doubtful territory," he said. "We may lose some, but we hope to gain at least as many as we lose. We probably will lose a few along the eastern seaboard, but make them up in the west."

The Oklahoma said he believed it likely his party would gain as many as five additional members from the public law losing delegation is now made up of nine Democrats and nine Republicans held by Democrats.

Victors by 600 Votes
Gannett, addressing 20 members of the G. O. P. National Executive committee and Republican members of the Senate and House, declared the public law losing confidence in the management of the war, he said it was the fault of the "higher-ups on the home front, not the men in uniform. He demanded that the "failures be thrown out" and me of ability and experience put in their places.

Urging his party to demand a "centralized or unified" command for the armed forces, Gannett said the Army and Navy were still jealous of each other and the top men in each branch were not giving adequate recognition to air power.

Spirit of Offensive Apparent in Britain

Civilians Not Only Amazingly Fit But Are Anxious to Get Ahead With Bloody Work.

By Dewitt Mackenzie
Wide World War Analyst
London, Sept. 30.—The most important thing your correspondent can report from his initial glance at this wartime Britain is that John Bull and his wife and youngsters—that is, the civilian rank and file—not only are amazingly fit and trim but are anxious to get ahead with the bloody work before them.

The spirit of offensive is everywhere. This is the first change I have had to size up Britain at close range since January, 1939. There was soon after little Czechoslovakia was sent to the sacrificial altar by the Munich appeasement pact and less than a year before the Hitlerian Frankenstein creature loosed his monster on an unprepared world.

Great Metamorphosis
One had expected to find changes, of course, but here is a great metamorphosis of the man in the street.

Here is a new John Bull—and I know my Briton, having been with him in war and peace through long years in many parts of the globe. Small things often signal big developments.

At the risk of being called fanciful, I'm going to confess to being mightily impressed during the short time I've been here by an odd circumstance: I haven't seen a single fat, or even plump, person.

Now, that is a matter of importance when you figure out why it is so, for while Britons as a whole don't run to avoidpoids, there always have been plenty of stout persons about, and the traditional John Bull is ample of waist.

Well Enough Fed
I don't mean to picture a people gnawing from hunger. They're well enough fed, though on pretty tight rations. But we have here a whole population which by the exigencies of war has trained down to the fitness of athletes.

Along with this there's another thing which gives pause for thought. I get the impression the people have reached the point where there might be a danger of overtraining. They have been so long set, tensely waiting for the word to get Hitler, that they are beginning to suffer a bit from the strain like a runner who is poised for a tardy starting gun.

Miners Facing Longer Hours

Question to Come Before Convention Opening Oct. 6 in Cincinnati

Washington, Sept. 30.—(AP)—Surinder of the 35-hour, five-day work week was posed today as a question facing John L. Lewis, United Mine Workers convention opening Oct. 6 at Cincinnati.

Lewis, meeting yesterday with coal mine operators at the request of Solid Fuels Coordinator Ickes to consider longer working hours to increase coal production for war needs, said he could not commit the UMW in advance of its convention.

Suggests Another Meeting
Expressing the opinion that miners would not give up the 35-hour week unless it was shown conclusively that it was necessary for the war effort, Lewis suggested another meeting be held with the operators Oct. 21 after the Cincinnati convention.

After rejecting Lewis' proposal for national negotiations he undertakes on a national basis instead of by regions, into which the bituminous coal industry is broken up.

Negotiations with the anthracite operators would be handled separately. Lewis' proposal failed to win an informal vote of approval at yesterday's meeting, a majority of bituminous operators favoring negotiation on a regional basis.

"If we have to break the industry up into segments to negotiate, it means concessions will be delayed while one group of operators takes refuge behind the other, each saying let the other do it," the mine leader declared.

Agree To Report To Ickes
After rejecting Lewis' proposal for national negotiations the meeting adjourned upon agreeing on one thing—to report to Ickes on what had transpired.

This apparently left the matter where it stood when the fuel coordinator called the meeting.

In asking for a longer work week, Ickes said the manpower problem in the mines had become serious, but Lewis contended that more efficient and consistent operation of mines should produce all coal needed for the war.

Philadelphia, Sept. 30.—(AP)—Admiral Thomas C. Hart, former commander of Allied Naval forces in the western Pacific, believes that Army air fighters failed in the first day of the battle over Luzon and thus missed a chance to cripple Japan's drive to Java.

Hart, in an article in the Oct. 3 issue of The Saturday Evening Post, released today, also asserted that "fighters based on Oahu U. S. Asiatic fleet, now a member of the Navy's policy-making general board, made the statements in what The Post called 'an appraisal of our mistakes and our virtues.'"

He said the Japanese had to conquer Luzon as the first step toward Java because it was the strongest island in the Philippines and "the Japs could not leave this power unimpaired on their flanks."

"This was the place, and the time to have beaten our enemy in the air," he wrote. "On those fields were more than twice as many P-40's as the A. V. G. ever had, but again we failed to take much toll of the Japanese planes. That first day or so was our chance in the air, and we missed it. From there onward it was backward all the way, on the sea, on the land, under the sea and over both."

Discussing the Pearl Harbor attack, he said: "Fighters missed big chance." "It is to be expected that the supposedly best defensive weapon, the fighter plane, will interfere with such an attack and at least punish it severely. The fighters were based on Oahu's aerodromes missed their big chance."

"No one should have given high valuation to such old and very slow capital ships" as were lost in the raid, he added, but "the losses in large planes . . . were very serious."

"When it comes to assessing fault for Pearl Harbor, whose fault was it that Fifth Columnists were able to send out communications with such freedom?"

Hart also wrote that American submarines are inflicting heavy losses on the Japanese in the Pacific, both on merchant and fighting ships, and commented, "not so much can be said about . . . it."

Uncertain How Foot Hurt
