They saw the planes overhead, and cherished possessions together and fled to the shelters. Those who had civilian defense jobs to do, joined the rest of the group.

From here the scene shifts to an area where the warden and wardens were telephoning to headquarters the course and height of the planes in the air. The wardens also sent to the sheltering stations, and when the planes were in the sky, they were hitting the bull's eye, and bringing down one.

While the air-raid warden helped people into air-raid shelters, the photographer and cameramen to their headquarters. One warden was shown under a man of ether holding a telephone to his head, the rest of his body being completely covered by debris.

Then poisonous gas was discovered. The decontamination squads got into the buildings and rescued victims of gas attacks. The gas was removed by carbolic acid and taken to hospitals immediately. Then the squad goes back to decontaminating the highways and wash the streets of gas.

The auxiliary firemen are kept busy by helping the sick and caring for the air-raid wardens. The fire engine was seen when a woman was running up the street to get her bag and run in a very short time.
