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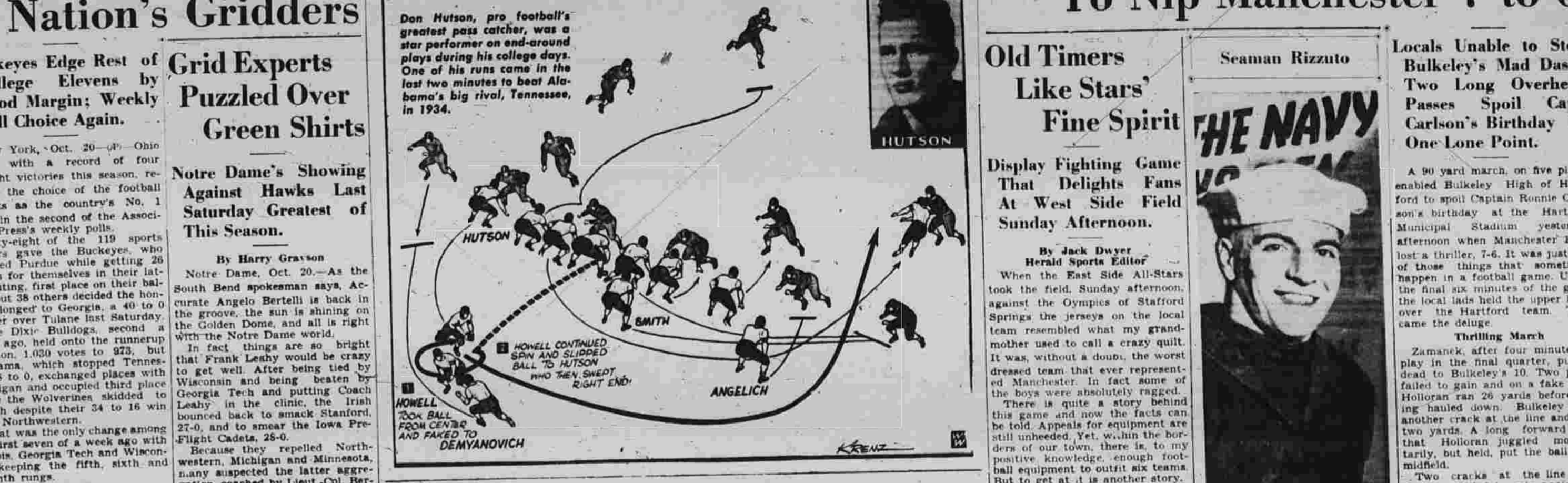

Russians Strengthen Stalingrad Positions; Storms Impair Drive

Continued Bad Weather Impairs Caucasus Offensive, Nazis Report; Strong Tank-Led Russian Diversion Attacks Against North Flank Of Thrust into Stalingrad Are Repulsed.

Berlin (From German Broadcasts), Oct. 21—(AP)—The German high command today said the Nazi drive into the Caucasus had been impaired by continued bad weather, and reported that strong, tank-led Russian diversion attacks against the northern flank of the German thrust into Stalingrad had repulsed the attacks.

The German high command also reported that the Russian offensive against the German positions in the Caucasus had been repulsed.

Red Army's Organ Says U. S. Ready

Enough Men and Equipment to Open Active Military Operations Is Seen by Red Star.

Moscow, Oct. 21—(AP)—The Red Army's official organ today asserted that the United States is ready now in men and equipment to open active military operations.

The Red Star said that the United States had been preparing for some time to open active military operations, and that it was now ready to do so.

Red Soldiers Work and Fight in Cold Rain to Beat Off Successive Attacks by Weaker Forces; Positions in Both Western and Central Caucasus Reported Improved.

Moscow, Oct. 21—(AP)—Red Army men were reported strengthening their positions at Stalingrad today, working and fighting in a cold rain that drenched the ruins, while beating off successively weaker attacks in the Western and Central Caucasus reported improved.

The Red Army said that its positions in both the Western and Central Caucasus had been improved, and that its soldiers were working and fighting in difficult conditions.

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Streamlining to Provide Critical Materials for First Things First.

Washington, Oct. 21—(AP)—The War Production Board announced today that it was changing its production priorities to ensure that critical materials were available for the production of essential war goods.

The board said that it was focusing on the production of items such as aircraft, tanks, and ships.
