



Calls for Meatless Tuesdays

Los Angeles, Oct. 28—(F)—Governor Olson called upon Californ-ians to observe voluntarily meating the first of the war beginning next Tuesday. It will be all right, his proclamation said, to eat such less demandows the first of the war beginning next the state of the sta

These are the two major offices at stake in the off-year election.

Issues Are Clear Cut

The issues are clear cut. Both parties want to win the war, and as quickly as possible. But the Democrats claim it can't be won expeditiously if pre-war isolationists like Brooks and Day are returned to office.

Republican hopes for victory are based in part upon an unusually large registration of voters flownstate, where the greatest G. O. P. strength lies. A total of 1,832,570 citizens have qualified to vote in this area, where only 1,600,001 cast their ballots in November, 1938, the last off-year election. Registration in Cook county (Chicago), the Democrate stronghold approximates 2,100,000.

Trend Appears Changing
Another factor encouraging to the Republicans is the increasing size of the party vote in recent elections. Democrats have outvoted them in every election since 1932. For the last two years, however, the trend appeared to be changing, and in the April 14 primary the G. O. P. came within 89,990 votes of catching up.

Generally quiet campaigns have been reported from other midwestern states.

In North Dakota the candidates ran into a late harvesting season that cut into their crowds, Secretary of State Herman Thorson has estimated that not more than 200,000 voters will go to the polls, compared with 275,105 in the 1938 general election. Gov. John Moses, the only Democrat in the state house, is opposed by his lieutenant governor, Oscar W. Hagen, heading a coalition ticket.

Pre-war isolationism is an issue in Wisconsin, where Republican Gov. Julius P. Hell seeks a third term against Democratic, Progressive, and Socialist candidates.

The G. O. P. has a 2 to 1 registration advantage in South Dakota. There Gov. Harian J. Bushfiela, Republican, stands for a Senate seat against former Gov. Tom Berry, a Roosevelt man.

In Minnesota, 35 year old Gov. Haroid E. Stassen, soon to enter the Navy, leads the Republican candidates in a spirited campaign Gov. George A. Wilson of Iowa, a Republican, is attempting to oust Democratic Lyde L. Herring from the Senate. Former Gov. Nelson A. Kraschel, a Democrat, is pitted against Lieut, Gov. B. B. Hicklenlooper in the gubernatorial

race in Iowa.




