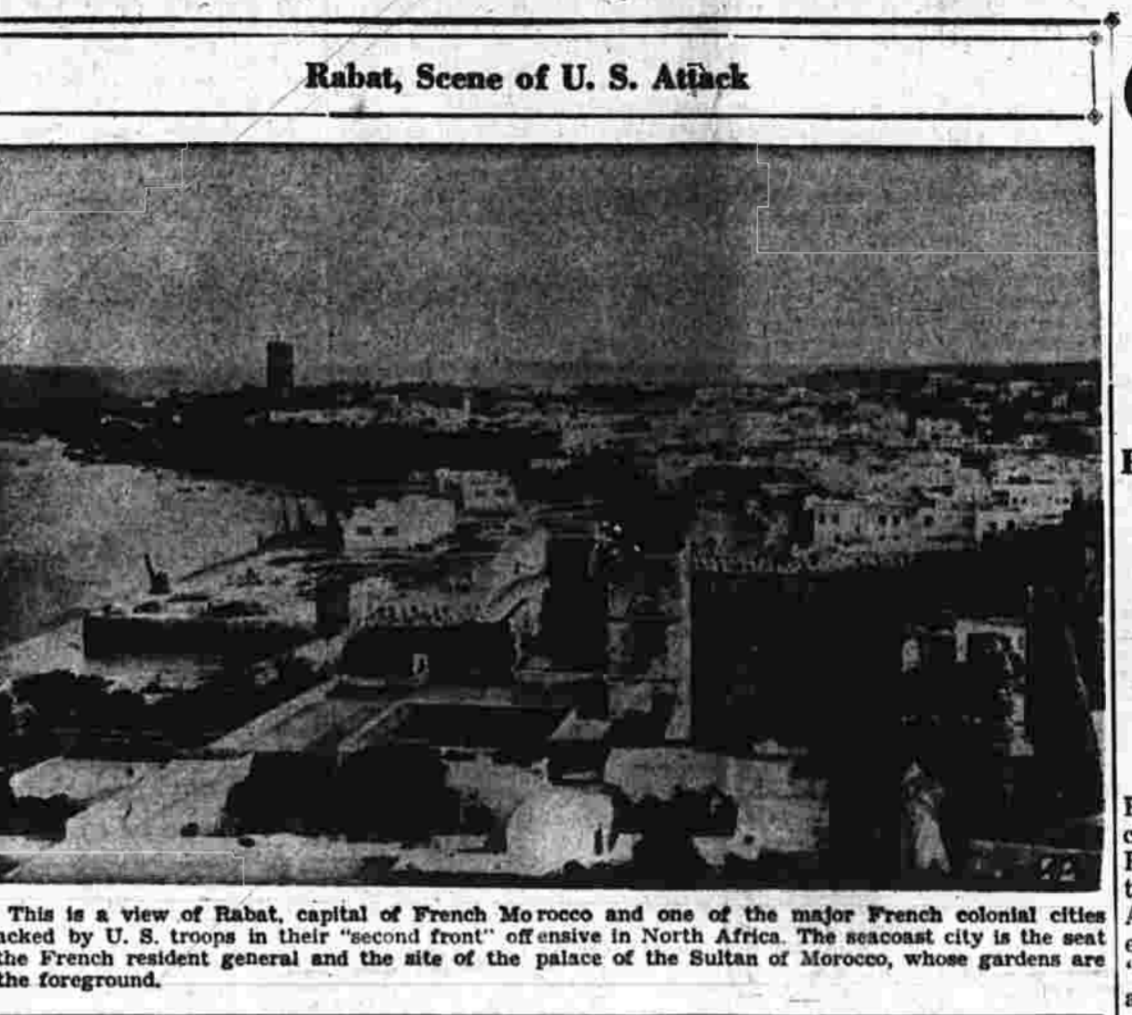

Service Wives Given Advice

Spouse of General Has Developed Witty Philosophy on Wars.

Washington, Nov. 10.—Mrs. Beatrice Patton, who is seeing her husband, Maj. Gen. George Smith Patton through his third war, today had ten bits of advice for wives of Army and Navy men fighting overseas.

The former Beatrice Ayer of Boston has developed a witty philosophy, tempered by major changes in her home address, as the helpmate for 32 years of a man who made some of his profession and who now is commanding the American forces on the west coast of Africa.

"I took the other two very pretty hard," she said, referring to the Mexican campaign against Pancho Villa, in which her husband was said to General Pershing and the First World War in which he was organized and commanded the first U. S. tank corps.

"One of the hardest things women have to bear in wartime is waiting," she said, recalling that when her husband came home from France in 1919 "having been previously wounded and left for dead, and decorated for extraordinary heroism in the battle of Belleau Wood, he was in fine shape, but I was not."

"I had practically lost my health," she said, and that prompted her to draw up the following ten-point regimen:

1. Don't worry. Look on the bright side, smile—and if things are plump up and you can't see your way clear, try gratitude.

2. Write cheerful letters to your fighting men. You cannot ask advice from a man in Libya, Australia, or the Philippines; also out of the first World War as well as the present.

4. Never listen to rumors—and never repeat one (she added) here that one of the finest of the Boston Herald's rumor columns which seeks to run rumors to ground.

5. Don't stop at the headlines when you read the paper. Buy a reliable newspaper and read the official communications and consult with friends and family.

6. Don't turn on the radio every time you come in the house. Set yourself a stated time to listen to it.

7. Get yourself a regular job, outside the home, even though it is only a few hours a week.

8. Realize you are not the only one whose husband is away at war. Don't feel sorry for yourself, but do feel for your fellow soldiers.

9. When the fighting man comes home on leave, make a holiday of it—not a family problem study.

10. Keep your family intact after all that is what our men are fighting for—their homes.

U. S. MARINES For 167 YEARS On Land At Sea

Marine Corps Winds Up 167 History Making Years

For 167 years from 1775 to the present day U. S. Marines have been making glorious history and a great deal has been written and said about America's oldest armed force.

Like almost all other things that develop for the good of the people or for our country, the Marine Corps had a modest beginning out of which has sprung a tremendous fighting force determined, as always, to protect the lives and freedom of the American people.

Before an unauthorized group could be formed, the Continental Congress, on November 10, 1775, resolved: "That two battalions of Marines be raised... and that particular care be taken that no person be appointed to officers or enlisted in said battalions but such as are good seamen or so acquainted with maritime affairs as to be able to serve to advantage by sea when required... and that they be distinguished by the name of American Marines."

Conspicuous in naval history was their part, under John Paul Jones, in the battle between the Bonhomme Richard and the Serapis, in which the Marines outnumbered the British 137 to 49 and were killed or wounded.

Shortly after the Revolutionary War, the Marine Corps, as well as the Army and Navy, was disbanded. The Corps was re-established on July 11, 1798.

In 1803, Marines took part in the fight between the frigates Philadelphia and the Tripolitanas. The remarkable march of General Eaton and his men from Alexandria to Derah, nearly six hundred miles across the desert of Northern Africa, resulted in the capture of the Tripolitan flag was hailed down there for the first time in the history of the country the flag of the Republic was hoisted on a fortress in the old world.

18 Months To War End

Fish Favors Army to Enforce Conditions of 'Just Peace.'

Washington, Nov. 10.—Predicting the war would end within 18 months, Representative Fish (R., N. Y.) declared today that an international Army should be maintained to enforce the conditions of "a just world peace."

Fish, an outspoken critic of President Roosevelt's foreign policy before Pearl Harbor, is the ranking Republican member of the House Committee on Foreign Affairs and on Rules.

"If it is a just peace," he said in an interview, "then I'm in favor of some association of nations in which a police force to maintain it. But if it is a peace based on revenge and imperialism, I don't want to sacrifice the life of a single American soldier to maintain such a peace."
