Fleet Gets War News Slower Than Civilians

the airfield at Kieta damaged news one morning. Most main-landers knew the news hours be-fore we did—by reading early editions of their newspapers or by tuning in their radios. There's only one radio aboard this cruiser—and it's for official use only. "The necessity of preserving radio silence," concluded the conmunique, "in order to avoid dis-closure of the ships' positions de-layed receipt of the above com-

Probably because our immedi-ate disappointment had been so keen not a man aboard got much "lift" from that communique smashing as the raid had been. Don't, however, get the idea your Naval officers and enlisted men let it dull their zest for action against the Japs. A few days later this force blasted 'em again.
