Gordon was found to be absolutely necessary, the commissioners state. This has been found to be the procedure followed in other municipalities, it was said, and it was pointed out that practically the same move was made by the Hartford police board recently.

The commissioners feel that Officer Prentice has obtained valuable experience with the Federal Bureau of Investigation. They point out that he ranked high at the police officers' school in Washington, and that his standing was recognized through the invitation extended him to join the FBI staff. The board feels that he possesses knowledge of modern police department management that no other member of the department can possibly have. They feel that this knowledge and experience will be invaluable to the town and the department.
