





It is a magnificant contribution to the Allied war effort and an equally great contribution to the progress of civilization.

During the 11 days it took me to reach Cairo from England by davious routes, I covered some 8,000 miles, mainly by air. Since I had already flown the Atlantic to reach Britain, it needs small imagination to see that if this war does nothing else, it is opening up the world to air transport.

I was in Lisbon the day Uncle Sam made his sensational landing on Northern Africs. The medley of peoples who go to make up the Portuguese capital's population these days—a weird mixture of Allied and Axis nationals who mingle in this neutral port—seethed with excitement.




