Byrd Pledges Payroll Cuts

Committee to Concentrate on Reducing War Agencies Costs.

Washington, Nov. 20.—(AP)—Declaring the Federal payroll had almost doubled in the past year, Chairman Byrd (D., Va.) of a joint economy committee today pledged an effort to prune the excesses of all government agencies, from the White House down.

War Output At Standstill

That seems to be the chief danger where savings can be made, Byrd said. "We may be able to attain abolition of the WPA, which was given about \$400,000,000 this year, but not many other cuts can be made in the non-war agencies."

Executive Staff Large

Byrd said the committee learned that on Sept. 1 the executive staff payroll under President Roosevelt totaled a yearly outlay of \$2,999,460 for employment of 726 persons in the District of Columbia and 180 persons outside. This did not include, he said, any of the emergency agencies set up under executive authority, such as the Office for Emergency Management.

More Rationing Looms As Shortages Appear

Department of Agriculture Officials Warn Shortages Faced in Many Important Foods

By Ovid A. Martin
Washington, Nov. 20.—To ration or not to ration. This is a question which has government food officials perplexed. It may give up a debate far more heated than that being waged over limitations on gasoline.

For weeks the Department of Agriculture and its spokesmen have been warning that the nation faces a serious shortage of many important foods. Some of these shortages, they say, are beginning to show up. Others will develop later in the winter, while still others are expected to materialize in 1943 or in the spring of 1944.

Yet only two food items have been placed under ration. They are sugar and coffee. Sugar rationing, which was begun several weeks ago, will get under way this month.

Work on Meat Rationing
The War Production board has directed the government's rationing agency, to work out plans for meat rationing. The board's statement that such a plan is being worked out is the first since 1943, there has been no official indication of what the most rationing may be.

But even more critical shortages are expected in the agriculture department to be developing in the case of butter, eggs, and other products.
