Local Man's Appeal Denied by President

Selective Service Case Referred to Chief Executive by State Director Averill.

Presidential action on the first selective service case from Manchester to reach that high, has been taken in favor of the local boy.

The case of Philip B. Berry, 23, of 140 Spruce street, has been decided in accord with the action of the Manchester Selective Service Board. Appeals can be taken to the President of the United States on a dependency claim only.

This particular case was referred to the President by State Selective Service Director, Major William Averill and not by the registrant, Berry.

Reason for the Appeal

Berry sought a dependency classification because of the physical condition of his mother. A doctor's affidavit stated would be a hard case for the mother's condition.

The local selectives board, after a hearing on such a condition should have been granted to the man in Class 1A.

The registrant filed a notice of appeal from the board's decision. The appeal was referred to a specialist's examination of the condition of the registrant's mother. The state selectives board headquarters ruled against Berry in Class 3A, a dependency status.

Basis of Dependency in Case

State Director Averill was of the opinion that there was no dependency in the case and stated that neither the local board nor the board under the draft regulations could speculate as to the extent of a registrant's dependency on the physical condition of any person. On that ground, the appeal was denied to the President. His finding here out the original decision of a local board.

It added that "submissions to intimidation is tantamount to increased pressure."

Lord Selborne, minister of economic warfare, made a similar statement for the British House of Lords.

He warned that the German making payments of facilitating the traffic would be regarded as "being engaged in trading with the benefit of the enemy" and would be liable to the same penalties as the enemy.

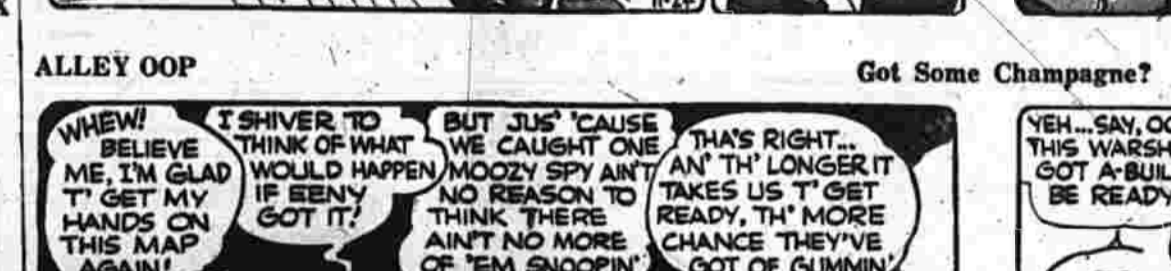

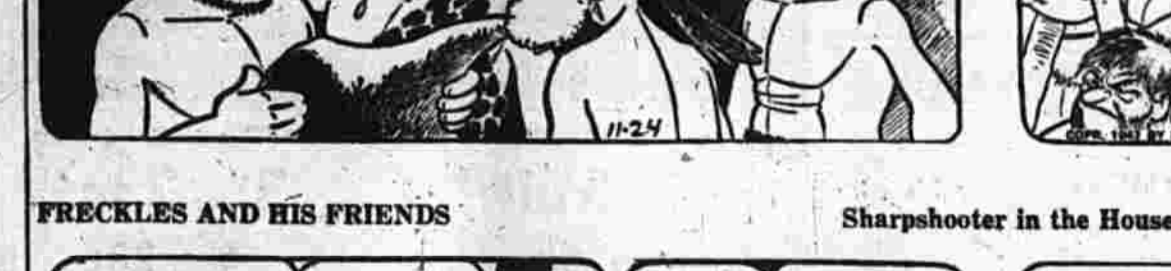
