In Terms of Production United States 45 Per Cent at War After Pearl Harbor.

By Sterling Green—Washington, Dec. 4.—(AP)—One year after Pearl Harbor, America is 45 per cent at war in terms of production.

Assign Quotas On War Bonds

Manchester Residents Requested to Invest \$90,937 in December.

Hartford, Dec. 4.—The United States Treasury has called upon Connecticut to invest \$14,700,000 during December in War Savings Bonds. It was announced today by State Administrator Philip Hewes.

This amount, it was emphasized, is the amount that must be raised by the sale of Series E, the low denomination War Savings Bonds. With the transfer of the Series F and G bonds to the Victory Loan Committees, War Savings Committees will concern themselves only with the E bonds.

While the December quota is lower than November's, it does mean a lessening of War Savings activities for Administrator Hewes points out that greater effort than ever before will be essential in order to attain the quota.

Mr. Hewes said, "What we will fill our quota. We know Connecticut reached its quota for the first time in October, and we are reasonably certain we reached it in November. There is no reason why we should fail in December."

The quota assigned to Manchester is \$90,937.
