ARMY FEARS DIET POWERS

London, Dec. 11.—(AP)—A tank-led Axis attack drove through to little more than a half mile from the important crossroads at Medjed El Teah, 20 miles southwest of Tunis, but faltered there under destructive fire from Allied artillery and fighter planes.

Ration Board Defies Order Will Not Resign Or Ration Fuel Oil, Letter Asserts.

Joplin, Mo., Dec. 11.—(AP)—Joplin's rationing board won't resign and it won't ration fuel oil, its Chairman Tom J. Foley said last night in a letter to the Federal Oil Administration.

Foley's letter demanded conclusive proof that oil rationing is necessary to relieve the east and aid the war effort.

"We have not been able to handle the fuel oil program in this area and it is our opinion that rationing of this fuel is unnecessary," the letter explained.

The methods employed are impractical, needlessly complicated and wasteful, and if carried out would cause further confusion and wear, needless suffering.

The letter asked that oil rationing be permitted to continue to sell fuel oil on temporary delivery receipts for surrender of ration coupons later, and asked permission to allow 80 to 85 per cent of last year's consumption without further rationing.

2,000,000 Jews Slain by Nazis

London, Dec. 11.—(AP)—The women's International Zionist organization asserted today that the Nazis had exterminated more than 2,000,000 Jews in "central clearing houses for mass slaughter" and urged the governments of the United Nations to issue a joint statement promising punishment of those responsible.

A war of extermination is proceeding relentlessly," Bertie Sieff, chairman of the organization, said in a manifesto to the women of the world. "The remaining Jews in occupied Europe and Hitler's satrapy state are being wiped out unless the free world speaks."

DRINKING WHITES OF RAW EGGS MAY AFFECT CANCER

Chicago—(AP)—Daily drinking of large quantities of whites of raw eggs, says a preliminary report by two New York doctors, has had a beneficial effect on the advanced cases of cancer, but one of the physicians explained, the experiment proved no claim for a cancer cure.

Dr. Ira J. Kaplan and Milton Zuroff of the radiation therapy department of Bellevue hospital, New York, made the report recently to the Radiological Society of North America.

Dr. Kaplan, who read the paper, said in an interview that the experiment "merely opens a field for further research and study in the hope of finding something that might be useful in developing a cure for the disease. The duration of the study (three months) and the small number of cases preclude the possibility of definite conclusions."

Findings Inconclusive

After Dr. Kaplan's paper was read, Dr. Lowell S. Gorn of Los Angeles, said the report was based on "inconclusive findings" while Dr. Robert S. 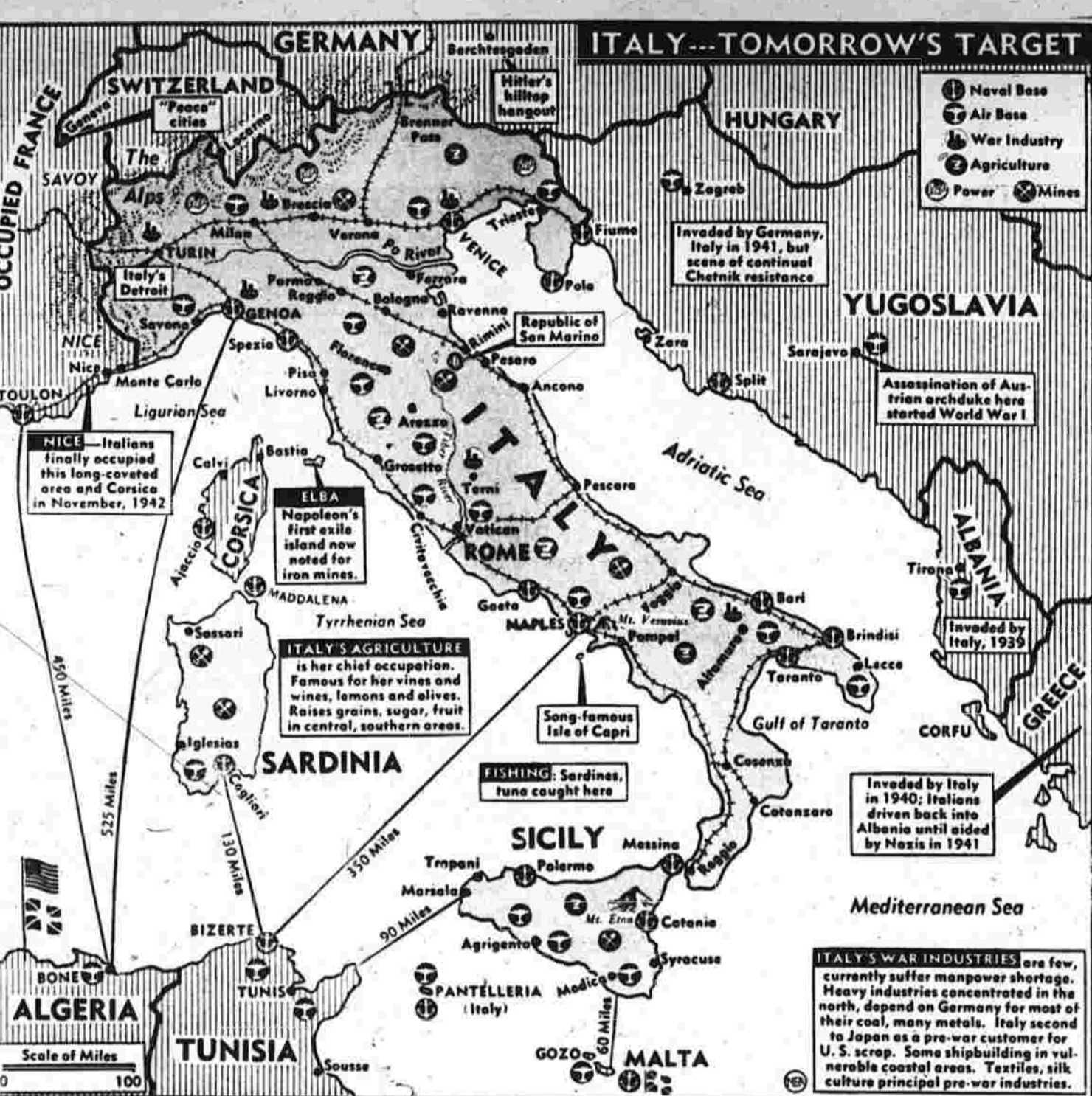
