Herding Cost \$91,000 in 1941

These reindeer herds are both government-owned and privately owned by Alaska natives, mostly Eskimos. No deer have been owned by white residents of the territory for a number of years. Eskimos are employed as herders, and, paid a nominal sum in cash, they take the remainder of their pay in deer, which then are herded along with the government stock.

along with the government stock. This herding, with other administrative expenses, cost the government \$91,000 last year—when, incidentally, the herds decreased by 31,000 animals.
The threat to the reindeer b came of paramount importance this area with the declaration war. Reindeer meat always been a winter staple for such towns as Nome, Kotzebue, Teller Wainwright and Point Barrow, all unreachable by ship during the winter months. With the influx of

war workers, the demand was greatly increased.

Might Be Only Food Supply
Should the territory be cut off

Attempt To Cut Menace

Some attempts to cut the wolf menace are underway at present, with debatable success. It is diffi-cult to induce a native to go trapping with only the promise of bounties—\$20 a pelt—when he can obtain work at high wages in al-most any Alaska town. Too, the work of ground wolf killers has falled in some instances to reduthe menace much even when it was done extensively. Rood him-self believes the only answer is the employment of government at planes flying at altitudes to enough to permit shooting of the wolves from the planes after the Montana-Idaho country.
