

These forms are to list jobs in a plant in the order which the employer believes his men should be inducted if the need arises, and to list the length time required to train replac

Considerable Misunderstandin There seems to be considerabl misunderstanding of some of the principles of the salary and wage controls. Principal misconception relates to the kinds of raises which can be given without ap-proval of the Treasury or War La-bor Board.

The regulations say that raises for promotions, for merit and for length of service can be handed out, without getting approval, only in cases where there is an established agreement or rate schedule. Otherwise, approval must be obtained beforehand.

However, one of the illustrations in the Treasury's printed explanation shows that an employ who is promoted may be paid a salary within the salary range previously paid to individuals occupying the advanced position—without official review. Also, the War Labor board has said that women employes may be raised to the pay levels of mer during the same kind of work.
